
11:25 am: Rob Cooper, Living Turf, Executive Chairman **"Innovative Practices in Regenerative Farming"**

1. "Creating a sustainable image/brand that highlights how growers can be seen as 'good Eco Stewards'."

Workshopping together we will create a unique sustainability statement per group, that could be used in turf marketing/branding. These statements will then be utilised by Turf Australia, (as endorsed by our industry). It is vitally important for Australian Turf Producers to now be genuinely affiliating themselves with the land, for the future and for your children's, children's children.

We will split into groups of 10 to work together to discuss and notate how turf farmers might see and describe their commitment to eco-stewardship in a personal business statement, and how these statements can be utilised to affect a change in community perception of turf/lawns. Working together each group will come up with a genuine creative statement.

Note: Rather than being seen as depleting the land, turf growers need to be seen to be giving back to the land. Each turf farm has the capacity to create and commit to their own Eco- Steward brand / statement that will be favorably recognized by all sectors of the supply chain and especially the wider community. These statements can be utilised in marketing, on invoicing and literally at farm gates.

We are convinced that our efforts in protecting our natural resources reflect in the quality of wines we make. Quite simply, if we're to focus on excellence in winemaking, it absolutely requires excellence in environmental management — the two are inseparable.


