

AIFLAM Course Update March - June 2021

We have 3 upcoming courses scheduled for the first half of 2021, all to be delivered in an online format via Zoom. All of our programs delivered in this format in 2020 were fully subscribed (some with waitlists) with members keen to take up the opportunity to become qualified as accredited NMAS mediators, or registered arbitrators pursuant to Regulation 67B. Delivery of our programs in this way has ensured that AIFLAM is able to continue to fulfil its important role as a specialist provider of training in the area of mediation and arbitration.

The following online courses are now open for registration:

NMAS Re-accreditation Day – 17 March 2021

A very limited number of places remain for this program. Designed for those NMAS Accredited Mediators who are having difficulty meeting the NMAS re-accreditation requirements (mediation hours or CPD).

Arbitration Training Course – 30 April to 1 May 2021

This course will still run face to face alongside the Law Council of Australia Family Law Section National Family Law Conference in Adelaide in September, but in the interim it will run in the first half of the year, in an online format, for those family lawyers keen to secure registration as a Regulation 67B arbitrator.

Over the course of the program, participants will learn the essentials of arbitration - what it is and what it is not, the rules and statutory basis of Family Law Arbitration and how it fits into the family law dispute resolution system. Successful completion of the course will entitle attendees to be listed as a Family Law Arbitrator pursuant to Regulation 67B of the Family Law Regulations.
