Workshop Details: In 2019 we will reach the milestone of 50 years since the introduction of methadone treatment in Australasia. The introduction of agonist maintenance therapy represented an important shift in understanding of opioid dependence and the objectives of treatment. Over last 50 years our understanding of opioid dependence has developed substantially. Prof Walter Ling has been at the forefront of this development having been involved in foundational research for treatment options and patient centred treatment outcomes. Drawing on many years of research and clinical experience Prof Ling will share his unique perspective on opioid dependence, what we hope to achieve from treatment and how we can measure our success.
