

Financial abuse takes away a person's right to choose how they spend their money.

It is when a partner or family member uses money as a form of coercive control, but it can take many forms. For example:

- They are forced to show receipts or justify every purchase
- · They are made to take out debts in their name, but the money is for someone else
- · Their money is used in a way they don't agree with, like for gambling
- · They are pressured into giving or loaning money to family or friends
- They're not allowed to work when or where they want to
- They're not paid a fair wage in a family business

Judgement free conversations about money and help with financial independence




Individual support to manage finances, bills, debts and credit scores, and help create a savings plan
