CHEMICALS AND CANCER: What's New in Toxicology and Risk Assessment?

Exposure to certain chemicals can increase the risk of cancer. According to the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC), some chemicals are known human carcinogens, meaning they have been found to cause cancer in humans.

Regulatory and advisory agencies play a crucial role in assessing whether exposure to environmental chemicals pose a risk to the public and environmental health.

This conference will focus on the current state of knowledge of chemical carcinogenicity including new and emerging risk assessment tools.

Presentation themes include:

- An overview of chemical-induced carcinogenesis, the widely accepted paradigm of carcinogenesis
- Regulation and risk assessment of carcinogens and relevance to Australian regulatory and advisory agencies
- How chemical carcinogenicity is determined and how this information is used to set regulatory guidelines and standards
- Australian regulatory and advisory agencies rely primarily on IARC cancer classifications to assess risk.
 The IARC cancer classification system and process are explained
- Perspectives on elimination of animal assays in assessment of carcinogenicity
- Integrating computational tools into carcinogenicity assessments
- How risks are managed in the workplace and for public health
- The IARC model for assessing chemical carcinogenicity is critically appraised
- The USEPA and EFSA systems for determining and classifying carcinogenic pesticides
- Review and discussion of the carcinogenic potential of PFAS and nitrates
- Approaches for quantitative assessment of skin cancer risk from soil contamination: a benzo(a)pyrene case study.

Continuing Education Days

This year for the first time, ACTRA will be offering two Continuing Education days and sessions will include:

- How to prepare a witness statement and prepare for giving evidence in court and State Administrative Tribunals
- General principles of environmental health risk assessments with case studies in water quality, air quality and contaminated sites
- A full day workshop on the science of risk assessment as envisioned by the RISK21 collaboration. The goals of this workshop are to:
 - communicate the overarching principles of the RISK21 approach,
 - provide an introduction to the roadmap and visualisation matrix; and
 - conduct hands-on case studies to educate participants on the application of the RISK21 roadmap in risk assessment.

The 15th ACTRA Annual Scientific Meeting (ASM) will be held on Thursday, 31 August & Friday, 1 September 2023 at the Parmelia Hilton Perth. A two-day Continuing Education Course will precede the ASM on Tuesday, 29 & Wednesday, 30 August 2023. The venue for the workshop on Tuesday 29 August is to be confirmed.
