# **KEYNOTE SPEAKERS**



#### Plenary Session 1: Day One

Tuesday 6th July, 11:00 (AEST)
Moving backwards into the future: Indigenising the health professional curriculum

Dr Rhys Jones, University of Auckland

Rhys is a Māori public health physician and a Senior Lecturer in The University of Auckland's Te Kupenga Hauora Māori (TKHM/Department of Māori Health). He has taught at the University since 2002 and has a leadership role in Māori Health teaching and learning across the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences (FMHS). He leads strategic planning, Māori health curriculum development and implementation; and oversees broader curricula in FMHS programmes and capability building for Māori Health teaching and learning. His work extends into clinical programmes including Medicine, Nursing and Pharmacy.

Rhys is recognised nationally and internationally as a leader in Indigenous health education and research. In 2005-06, he was a Harkness Fellow in Health Care Policy based at Harvard Medical School in Boston, USA. He was International Lead Investigator of Educating for Equity, a multicentre collaborative research project, resulting in Educating for Indigenous Health Equity: An International Consensus Statement, which was published in Academic Medicine, the world's leading medical education journal (Jones et al, 2019). He has received a number of teaching and learning awards, including the Prime Minister's Supreme Award for Excellence in Tertiary Teaching in 2020.



#### Plenary Session 2: Day Three

Monday 12th July, 15:20 (AEST)
Probability, Complexity and Ambiguity:
implications for health professions education
Prof Karen Mattick, University of Exeter

Karen is committed to the highest possible quality in education and research, being motivated by academic work that makes a clear difference to healthcare processes and outcomes. Her two main areas of responsibility at the University of Exeter are Director of Postgraduate Education (PGT & CPD) for the College of Medicine & Health, involving education leadership of the portfolio of Masters programmes and short courses, and Co-Lead for the Centre for Research in Professional Learning, involving research leadership of projects involving healthcare education. She is committed to supporting healthcare practitioners to engage in scholarship, and much of her work is spent supporting postgraduate students and healthcare professionals to undertake research, scholarship or evaluation projects. In addition, she is Deputy Editor for the journal Medical Education, Director of Awards for the Association for the Study of Medical Education (ASME) and Visiting Professor at Queen's University Belfast. She is a Principal Fellow of the Higher Education Academy and National Teaching Fellow,

Her research interests include: Experiences of doctors-in-training, especially during the transition to clinical practice. Prescribing by doctors-in-training, especially in relation to prescribing antibiotics. Mental ill-health as it affects doctors-intraining.

She utilises a wide range of methodologies, including systematic and realist literature reviews, quantitative, qualitative and mixed methods research studies.

Why we need to create the social leaders of tomorrow


Dr Dinesh Palipana, Queensland Health

Dr Dinesh Palipana OAM is a senior resident at Gold Coast University Hospital and a researcher in spinal cord injury. Following a car accident in 2010, Dinesh became a quadriplegic. He has since completed his medical studies and a law degree. His own injury and his struggle to get a medical internship inspired him to become an advocate for medical students with disabilities. As a co-founder of Doctors with Disabilities Australia. Dinesh has worked with the Australian Medical Association to create national policies for inclusivity in medical education and employment. In his research at Griffith University, Dinesh has contributed to advances in the treatment of spinal cord injury and restoring function to people with paralysis.

He is also a doctor for the Gold Coast Titans Physical Disability Rugby League team and has received numerous awards, including Junior Doctor of the Year and the Order of Australia for service to medicine.

Dinesh was the Queensland Finalist for the 2021 Australian of the Year.

# VIRTUAL PLATFORM





The ANZAHPE 2021 conference will be delivered via the EventsAir Virtual Platform. Your unique login is personalised and will give you access to the conference program during the live event and on-demand access. You can use your link to access the Virtual Platform from your personal device.

#### **Program Timeline**


When you log into the platform, the full conference program listing all oral presentations and times will be displayed on the Program Timeline. A red line will move down the screen as the event proceeds, indicating the time sessions goes live. Scroll the timeline and save your 'favourites' by clicking on the star adjacent the sessions you don't want to miss – a handy tool to plan your day.

You will need to select each session you want to attend by clicking the View/Join button to the right of the presentation on the timeline. Breaks are scheduled throughout the program where you will have time to explore all areas of the virtual platform, including the Exhibition and Meeting Hub.

#### Log in details

Your unique log in will be emailed to you the day prior to the Festival. Please note your login is personalised and cannot be shared. Taking the time to log into the platform and setting up your profile ahead of the live event will save you time when logging in on the day. Setting up your profile is easy, simply follow the prompts and when complete, you are ready to explore the platform's features.

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Please note the Virtual Platform will automatically adjust to your local time zone.

#### **Equipment and Browser Information**

The following is suggested for the best user experience:

- Laptop or PC is recommended to access the virtual conference
- Compatible Browser, Google Chrome is the recommended browser
- A stable internet connection (Avoid having additional browser tabs open at the same time which could be draining on your internet bandwidth)
- Audio & mic (computer speakers and microphone). We recommend a headset if you are presenting
- Webcam this is not mandatory but will extend your experience, especially when participating in the meeting hub and exhibitor meetings
- Other virtual meeting platforms (eg Microsoft Teams) – we suggest you close or logout as these can interfere with your audio and video connections

#### **Attendee Participation**

#### Live Q & A

Each plenary and concurrent session block will conclude with a live Q&A with presenters who participated in the session available to answer questions from attendees. As attendees watch the presentations, questions can be added to the 'Q & A chat box' via text. During the live Q&A panel, submitted questions will be asked, with the panel providing live responses.

#### **Meeting Hub**

The meeting hub is where you can meet and interact with your colleagues. See who has logged in and attending the event, make new connections and engage in a live one-on-one video chat. Use the left-hand menu to find another attendee and invite them to become a "Connection". # Can more than one person use the conference login details?

No. Each registration is just for a single person, and your unique login is for your personal use only. Content cannot be exported out of the platform for a shared experience.

#### How do I setup my profile?

Upon logging in to the virtual platform, your Profile/ Account tab will appear - we encourage you to add a photo, short biography, and links to your social media accounts. You can edit your profile at any time. Your profile tab is also where you can restrict/allow what is seen in the Meeting Hub/online delegate list.

## What days/times are the sessions?

The dates are Tuesday 6 July, Thursday 8 July, Monday 12 July and Wednesday 14 July 2021. The time zone is based on Australian Eastern Standard Time (UTC +10). Please view the full program *here* for times and session details.

# When will I receive my unique log in for attending the event?

Your personal login will be sent you the day prior to the live event.

Please make sure the email address associated with your registration is accurate and up to date so there is no delay in receiving our communications.

# Will sessions be pre-recorded or live?

Most presentations will be pre-recorded but you have the opportunity to interact with presenters via the live Q&A sessions.

If the speaker is not available, we encourage you to post your question anyway. Speakers will be encouraged to type their reply to any questions not raised during the live Q&A and post online within the session Q & A chat box.

#### How do I join a session?

The Program Timeline shows all the sessions. To join a session or a talk, simply click on the View/Join button and you will be directed into the session page.

## How do I make sure I don't miss a particular session/talk?

In the Program timeline, every session/talk will have their own 'favourites' star icon – simply click on this icon and you will have it stored as your favourites. To access your favourite sessions/talks, simply click on the favourites icon located in the right hand corner below the time counter.

# Will I be able to jump from session to session during the conference?

Yes. But you will need to leave a session and click back to the program timeline before you can enter another session.

## Will sessions be recorded and available after the conference?

Yes, all presentations will be made available after the meeting. Access to member registrants for 12 months and non-member registrants for up to 2 months until 16 September 2021. This also includes access to the virtual exhibition and all handouts including abstracts.

# Will attendees be able to ask questions during sessions?

Yes, via the Q&A chat box in the session. Every oral presentation will include a Q&A segment. Delegates will have the ability to enter questions into the "Q&A chat box" and also vote on submitted questions, by giving a 'thumbs up' to assist the chair in selecting questions to ask. At the end of the presentation, the chairperson will read the questions to the speaker, who will then respond live (if available). If the speaker is not available, questions can still be entered in the Q&A chat box which will be answered by the speaker after the session and made available on demand in the Answered area of the Q&A box.

## Will we have access to abstracts?

Yes. Abstracts will be included as 'handouts' in all sessions. A full abstract book will be available to download by clicking on the link at the top of the Virtual Timeline.

#### What is the Virtual Exhibition?

The Virtual Exhibition is our 'exhibition hall' where you can view and meet our Sponsors. The virtual exhibition can be viewed anytime over each day of the conference and after the meeting until 16 September 2021.
