

PRE-RECORDED PRESENTATIONS

The following information will assist you with your preparation to pre-record your presentation for the upcoming HSR Conference.

PRESENTATION RECORDING

Please ensure you review the oral and/or poster presentation instructions on the conference website.

Your **Presentation Recording** must not exceed **your allocated time.** Please set the aspect ratio of your PowerPoint slides to **16:9**.

A reminder:

- Long Orals are 15 minutes maximum in length
- Short Orals are 5 minutes maximum in length
- 3 Minute Thesis (3MT) are 3 minutes <u>maximum</u> in length
- **Poster Presentation (optional recording)** are strictly 3 minutes <u>maximum</u> in length and will accompany your poster in the On Demand Poster Gallery only
- **Symposia Sessions** are asked to submit a pre-recorded summary of their symposium, at a maximum 30 minutes in length, in advance of the in-person event in Sydney. You may choose to focus on the contribution of one or two presentations from within the session, rather than trying to include all the content. The summary video recording can be delivered by one presenter on behalf of the group or include sections from each presenter.

You are free to record your video with any software you feel comfortable with. If you have little experience recording videos, we recommend using <u>either</u> of the following programs to complete your recording.

Option 1) Microsoft PowerPoint

If you are already familiar with Microsoft PowerPoint, you can use it to record both audio narration and, optionally, a webcam recording of yourself superimposed on the slides. Additionally, if you add your script to the Notes field, the notes will appear at the top of your screen (normally right below where the camera is located) to help you hold your gaze towards the camera.

The basic steps for recording are:

- a) Go to the "Slide Show" tab.
- b) Click on "Record Slide Show" button and select "Record from Beginning".
- c) Use the **"Settings**" button on the upper right corner allows you to select your microphone and camera.
- d) If you do not wish to be visible in the recording, you can turn off webcam recording using the little camera icon below your slides on the lower right corner.
- e) Click **"Record"** on the upper left corner. PowerPoint will start a 3-second countdown and then start recording. The recording will automatically stop after your last slide.

f) Select "File" -> "Export" -> "Create a Video" to save your recording on your hard drive (We recommend a resolution of 1080p to make sure the quality is high enough. Please do not go lower than 720p).

Option 2) Zoom

If you have created a Zoom account (including the free version), you can simply start a Zoom meeting and record the meeting to your local hard drive.

The basic process is as follows:

- a) Start a new Zoom meeting.
- b) "Exit Full Screen" if the meeting window has covered your whole screen by default.
- c) If you are using a slide deck, open it in a new window. In PowerPoint, you can set the slide show to begin in a window (instead of taking up the whole screen) by following these steps:
 - a. Go to the **"Slide Show"** tab
 - b. Click the "Set up Slide Show" button
 - c. Select "Browsed by an Individual Window"
 - d. Click the "From Beginning" button to begin the slide show.
- d) In the Zoom toolbar, click "Share Screen" and select the "PowerPoint window".
- e) Click **"Record"** in Zoom (it may be under the "More" button). You can also start recording by using the Alt+R combination on your keyboard.
- f) The recording will begin immediately. Go through your presentation. When you are done, click the **"Stop Recording"** button, or the Alt+R key combination again.
- g) End your meeting.
- h) Wait for the recording to be processed. It will be saved on your computer, and Zoom will open the folder with the recording.
