This time they dreamt big and initiated a project which would be the very first ever in Australia, they call it 'The Immersion Room'.

In the era of digital devices, we have an opportunity to enable better learning with technology. Virtual Reality (VR) seems to be the natural next step for the evolution of education.

VR can be used in classrooms to enhance student learning and engagement. It can transform the way educational content is delivered as it works on the premise of creating a virtual world — real or imagined.

As teachers we are always looking for ultimate engagement, our Immersion Room has enabled a multi-modal way of learning, motivating all learners to fully understand the world around them. This new resource offers teachers an innovative way of delivering content which requires less cognitive load for the students to process the information.
