



Uber and public transport partnerships

Uber is working with cities around the world to trial and scale public transport partnerships. This begins with simple first/last mile subsidies, to help increase pick-ups and drop-offs at bus and train stations, including ultimately the introduction of active modes alongside Uber's rideshare product. Off the back of some great partnerships elsewhere in the world, we think there is potential to partner with public transport providers in New Zealand to help extend the reach of the PT network.
