#### Funding model for the Bike Hubs

#### A diversified funding model with three key pillars...

- Income from the operation as a social enterprise (bike sales and koha)
- Auckland Transport key regional funder across all sites
- Local Boards –funding for each site















#### Bike Hub data from 2017 – May 2023

(for EcoMatters existing sites)

- Over 45,000 visitors
- More than 16,000 bikes fixed
- Over 3,000 bikes redistributed back in the community
- Over 9,000 hours of volunteer support

#### A need for an integrated network

#### Bus stops, ferry terminals, train stations... bike hubs

- AT must:
  - provide for all modes of transport
  - reduce GHG by 50% by 2030
  - achieve 5% cycling mode share by distance by 2030
- We provide bus stops & transport hubs, ferry terminals and train stations, but **what do we do for bikes?**
- A lot... but programmes are unseen and delivered via commercial models







## Making the network

- May 2022 AT secured funding for a project to deliver 10 new Bike Hubs
- Kaupapa of: by community, for community with AT backing
- Goal for: multiple partners across
  10 locations
- Grounded by: a strong, consistent model region-wide
- Benefits: social, economic, safety, environmental







#### How do you make it happen?

In 18 months

- 1. Use existing networks to find initial stakeholders
- 2. Co-design the model
- 3. Start searching for locations
- 4. Search and partner with operators
- 5. Work with Mana Whenua
- 6. Partner with a local artist for creative
- 7. Secure LOA, permits and resource consents
- 8. Undergo detailed design
- 9. Procure containers, tools and outfitting
- 10. Construct foundations
- 11. Deliver container to site
- 12. Engineer and deliver a canopy
- 13. Wrap the container in artwork
- 14. Launch the Bike Hub with media and marketing
- 15. Re-apply for funding
- 16. Repeat

## Imagine A future where...

**Bike Hubs are** normalising cycling by providing a low-barrier, supportive and inclusive place where everyone can feel comfortable getting basic bike repairs, participating in events, and learning from others.

#### The Bike Hub network is

- ✓ Reaching 50,000 people (~3% of Akl)
- ✓ Fixing 15,000 bikes
- ✓ Distributing 5,000 bikes
- ✓ Working with hundreds of volunteers
- ✓ Seen as the heart of all things bike in a community
- $\checkmark$  Delivering dozens of events and activations in strong partnerships


