OVERVIEW OF WORKSHOP

This workshop aims to delve into the ethical considerations surrounding the utilisation of Generative Artificial Intelligence (GenAI) in engineering education. We will examine the perspectives of both students and academics and investigate whether the existing ethical guidelines are sufficient or if they necessitate a redefinition in light of this disruptive technology. The discussion will also encompass the potential impact of GenAI on the future of engineering education and the responsibilities of educational institutions in preparing students for the ethical challenges associated with its use.

ACTIVITIES

The workshop will start with the facilitator's latest research on the ethical use of GenAl in engineering education. The audience will review case studies and ethical considerations, then break into small groups to further examine and debate these trends. Finally, the whole group will assess if the current ethical guidelines meet the requirements.

OUTCOMES
