"The Rural Generalist" – a pluripotent multiskilled professional able to do more in diagnostics, treatment, management and follow up.




Point of Care Ultrasound

- Evidence of improved diagnostic accuracy, patient outcomes, and learning
- Taught in the majority of undergraduate programmes in USA
- 10 minutes / 130- 600 scans per GP per annum
- False positives 4- 33% cardiac / 07- 3.2% obstetrics / 0.5 9.9% abdo
- False negatives up to 8.7% in cardiac / 0.02% 2.3%
- Patients useful / less travel / 29% "dr relies on technology"
- Reduces cost to system / pts willing to pay
- AAFP "focused rule-in test for patients with a high pre-test probability


