Her illustrious career culminated in 2023 with the prestigious Life Membership from Tourism Tropical North Queensland (TTNQ), underscoring her invaluable contributions.

Currently, Pip serves as a Director of the CaPTA Group, a family business now led by her three sons, Peter, Michael, and Ben. In this capacity, she ensures the perpetuation of their family's enduring legacy and commitment to the tourism industry.
