One-Stop-Clinic for post-menopausal bleeding- does it work? Outcome of two-year audit Dr S Sircar, L Keedle RN, Te Whatu Ora MidCentral

Endometrial cancer rate is rising steadily in New Zealand.

In 2019, we were not compliant with Faster Cancer Treatment (FCT) targets. Audit suggested two most common reasons for breaching are

- (a) waiting for ultrasound
- **(b)** waiting for hysteroscopy in theatre.

An One stop-clinic was implemented where women would be offered ultrasound the same day at the clinic. Depending on the scan result, the clinician would then perform biopsy / out-patient hysteroscopy.

Results

The pre clinic data (2014-2019) was compared with post clinic data (2022). This suggested improvement in all standards.

- 1. First specialist appointment within 14 days of urgent referral rose from 45% to 90% .
- 2. Treatment started within 62 days of receipt of urgent referral rose from 42 % to 74%.
- 3. Treatment to be started within 31 days of decision to treat rose from 77% to 87%. Referral to diagnosis is now 16 days compared to 48 days in 2019.

Discussion

An one-stop-clinic is a cost and time effective service increasing compliance with targets with reduced cost to the health service. The service is women centered, effectively use resources and improves outcomes.
