












WACHS has continued to experience critical Psychiatry workforce shortages despite significant investment in every WACHS region as part of the \$1.5+ billion infrastructure modernisation program





01. Background

Psychiatry Training

Training to become a Psychiatrist takes 5 years, made up of 10 six-month training terms.

- Stage 1 (1 year)
 Compulsory: at least 1 Adult Acute inpatient term
- Stage 2 (2 years)
 Compulsory: Consultation-Liaison Psychiatry term and Child & Adolescent Psychiatry term
- **Stage 3** (2 years)
 Optional Advanced subspecialty training certificates:
 - Addiction psychiatry
 - Adult psychiatry
 - o Child and adolescent psychiatry
 - Consultation-liaison psychiatry
 - Forensic psychiatry
 - o Psychiatry of old age
 - Psychotherapies

Metro Training Bottlenecks

Despite having over 20 passionate RANZCP supervisors in rural WA, we had an **average of 6 trainees per term** over the last few years

- Unfilled positions are challenging to maintain, leading to dependence on a locum medical workforce and inconsistent care for rural communities.
- Most WA trainees don't complete rural terms, often only completing 6 months before returning to Perth.
- Of the 50+ who graduated in WA in the last 5 years,
 only 4 new Psychiatrists are working in rural WA
- There has been strong interest in Psychiatry training in WA, but we have had the lowest intake in Australia for 9 years in a row.






Our team are based in Bunbury, home to one of our three Comprehensive Training Hubs.


All of the RPTWA team have lived and worked in regional and rural communities, helping us understand the unique challenges and opportunities of living in rural Western Australia.






When we can recruit our own Trainees, we can retain them in our communities and "grow our own" future Psychiatrists








Projected Trainee Numbers (Moderate Growth Model)

02. Overview of the Program Training Locations

The RPTWA program will provide training at 26 accredited WACHS posts.

Comprehensive Training Hubs

Stage 1 trainees will be allocated to one of three Comprehensive Training Hubs, which each have the full range of training posts required for completion of a 5-year generalist RANZCP Fellowship.

- Great Southern Albany (8 posts, 5 Supervisor FTE)
- Kimberley Broome (6 posts, 4 Supervisor FTE)
- South West Bunbury (6 posts, 7 Supervisor FTE)

Rural Training Centres

Trainees will also have the option to explore the unique and well-supported training posts available at each of our Rural Training Centres.

- South West Busselton (1 post, 1.5 Supervisor FTE)
- Midwest Geraldton (1 post, 4 Supervisor FTE)
- Pilbara Port Hedland (2 posts, 2 Supervisor FTE)
- Wheatbelt Northam (2 posts, 2.9 Supervisor FTE)





Trainee & Supervisor Support

Due to the small size of the training program and the risk of personal and professional isolation for Trainees & Supervisors, we are establishing a comprehensive support program including:

- 1:1 Training and Pastoral Support from RPTWA Staff
- Independent Support & Crisis Pathways
- Peer support and mentoring for Trainees & Supervisors
- A supportive Trainee accommodation & relocation package
- A directory of local services & contacts to help Trainees, Supervisors and their families settle in their community
- A library of educational material to help Trainees & Supervisors with self-directed learning
- Orientation, safety & security resources to complement existing WACHS policies and procedures.





03. Our Activities So Far Key Milestones

Over the last 12 months our plan has evolved from developing a simple "rural stream" within the existing WA Program, to creating the first new RANZCP training zone in over 20 years and the first ever Rural training zone.

August 2021

• 28 Rural WA Psychiatrists write to WACHS pledging support for a Rural Psychiatry Training program.

October 2021

 WACHS CE writes to RANZCP WA BTC to pledge funding for Rural Director of Training and future RPTWA staff.

November 2021

• Minister for Mental Health writes to RANZCP WA to express support for a Rural Psychiatry pathway within WACHS.

February 2022

• RANZCP WA BTC provide "In Principle" support for a separate WA rural training program.

May 2022

 Team travel to RANZCP Congress in Sydney to advocate for program. Receive support from President, CEO, Board members & many interstate Directors of Training

June 2022



Accreditation Application

The final training program application was 78 pages long, covered over 50 accreditation standards and included a further 98 appendices.

To help the Accreditation committee develop a better understanding of our program and the fantastic training opportunities in each WACHS region, we developed separate Program Overview & Regional Overview documents.





03. Our Activities So Far Building Regional Capacity

We have a series of initiatives that will aim to support and build on the existing Training capacity in each Region



- We have completed **mapping of the WACHS MH medical workforce** and will work with each region to develop 5-year growth plans for increasing Training posts and Supervisor capacity.
- This work is happening in parallel with efforts to **map Mental Health** service demand (projected vs actual) and benchmark against metropolitan & interstate data.



We hope to use this data to develop joint funding proposals with WACHS Regions and go in partnership to source State and Federal permanent funding for increased Regional Trainee and Supervisor FTE over the coming years.





03. Our Activities So Far Ongoing Activities

- **Bunbury TTR** Working to eventually move to dedicated offices within the new Bunbury Hospital Teaching, Training and Research (TTR) Development, establishing a world first Centre of Excellence in Rural Psychiatry Education & Training.
- **WARPPP** Working with WACHS Medical Education Unit to develop the WA Rural Psychiatry Prevocation Pathway, an education & promotional program for Junior Doctors completing Mental Health placements.
- GP Training Pathways Working with WACHS Rural Generalist team to get all WACHS Psychiatry training posts jointly accredited for GP Advanced Training.
- Supervisor Peer Support Organising online Peer group for Psychiatry Supervisors across 5 WACHS regions.

Three or five year length of training contracts, full-time from February 2023

This Expression of Interest is for Stage 1 training entry and Stage 2 & 3 training positions:

- 2 positions for RANZCP Stage 1 entry in Albany, Great Southern Region
- 2 positions for RANZCP Stage 1 entry in Bunbury, South West Region
- More than 10 positions for existing Stage 2 & 3 RANZCP trainees transferring to our new program across WACHS including Albany, Broome, Bunbury, Geraldton, Northam & Port Hedland.

The successful applicant will be committing to a length of training contract with WACHS (three to five years, dependent on RANZCP training stage) commencing February 2023.

The program provided by Rural Psychiatry Training WA is overseen by the Branch Training Committee, Western Australia in accordance with the requirements for obtaining Fellowship of the Royal Australian New Zealand College of Psychiatrists (RANZCP). The training program provides clinical and formal supervised training experiences in rural generalist psychiatry, with Stage 3 trainees completing Certificates of Advanced Training considered on a case by case basis.




