Early in 1998, a number of head and neck oncologists from the disciplines of surgery, radiation oncology and medical oncology met in Sydney to discuss the feasibility of establishing a multidisciplinary head and neck cancer society. A working party was formed and following a number of meetings, invitations were sent to individuals in these three specialties to become foundation members of the Australian and New Zealand Head & Neck Cancer Society.

The initial business meeting was held on December 9, 1998 and at that time there were 60 foundation members. The Society adopted as its Constitution the Model Rules for Associations published by the Department of Fair Trading in NSW and the members agreed that their principal objectives would be to promote the practice of head and neck oncology, to educate medical colleagues and the public about our specialty, to foster research and to seek optimal treatment outcomes for our patients.

Keynote Speakers



Professor Anil D'Cruz Mumbia. India

Dr D'Cruz MS, DNB, FRCS (Hon) is the Director of Oncology, Apollo Hospitals, Mumbai, Delhi and Chennai. He is well-recognised as a global leader,

clinician, researcher and teacher and was former Director of Tata Memorial Hospital and Chair Head Neck Services with over 33 years' experience. In addition, Dr D'Cruz is committed to cancer control, prevention, early detection and equity/access to cancer care. He is the Immediate Past President of the Union International for Cancer Control Geneva and was awarded the Honorary FRCS from the Royal College of Surgeons of England in recognition of his professional standing in the field.

Dr D'Cruz has held leadership positions and is on the board of numerous professional organisations, universities, research organisations and cancer institutions across the country and abroad. He is current Chairman of the Foundation of Head Neck Oncology (FHNO) India having earlier served as President of FHNO and President of the Asian Society of Head Neck Oncology and is also the current President of the Indian Society of Thyroid Surgeons.

Dr D'Cruz has more than 500 peer-reviewed publications and chapters to his name and has delivered more than 1000 invited lectures and over 150 named lectures, keynote and orations, both nationally and internationally. He has also been a special invitee to over 100 conferences nationally and internationally demonstrating head and neck surgery.



Dr Andrew Foreman Adelaide

Dr Foreman is an Otolaryngology Head and Neck Surgeon at the Royal Adelaide Hospital in Adelaide, Australia. He completed a PhD in 2011 through

the University of Adelaide which won the University Doctoral Research medal as well as multiple awards at national and international meetings. Dr Foreman completed his surgical training in Adelaide before undertaking a head and neck surgical oncology and microvascular reconstruction Fellowship at the University of Toronto. His primary clinical interests are in trans oral robotic surgery as well as microvascular free flap reconstruction of head and

neck defects. Dr Foreman is a Senior Lecturer at the University of Adelaide and has research interests in clinical outcomes research, next generation magnetic tracers for sentinel lymph node biopsy and enhanced recovery after surgery (ERAS) protocols. Dr Foreman has published more than 55 peer-reviewed articles and 7 book chapters. He is on the Editorial Board of two international journals and regularly reviews for multiple peer-reviewed journals. Dr Foreman has a strong interest in teaching and training and is currently the Chair of the Board of ENT training in Australia and New Zealand.



Professor Katherine Hutcheson Houston, United States

Dr Kate Hutcheson is a Professor and Deputy Director of Clinical Research in the Department of Head and Neck Surgery with dual appointment in the

Division of Radiation Oncology at the University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center. She serves as Section Chief and Research Director for the Section of Speech Pathology and Audiology. Dr Hutcheson is a certified speech-language pathologist with 18 practice years, a Board Certified Specialist in Swallowing and Swallowing Disorders (BCS-S) and Fellow of the American Speech Language Hearing Association. Dr Hutcheson is a clinical epidemiologist leading an internationally recognized, extramurally funded clinical research program. She has authored over 150 peerreviewed manuscripts with funding support from the National Institutes of Health, Patient Centered Outcomes Research Institute, the MD Anderson Institutional Research Grant Award program, and the CPRIT UT Health Innovation Training Program. She is an Associate Editor for the Head and Neck and Dysphagia journals. She is an accomplished clinician and educator who lectures nationally and internationally on radiation associated dysphagia and head and neck cancer rehabilitation.

Associate Professor Jørgen Johansen Odense. Denmark

Associate Professor Johansen is the Chief Physician at the Department of Oncology, Odense University Hospital, Denmark and Associate Professor

at the Institute of Clinical Research, University of Southern Denmark since 2004. He is the supervisor of several PhD students and Master of Public Health as well as medical graduate research projects at the universities in Aarhus, Odense, and Copenhagen.

His research focuses on head and neck cancer. fast-track clinical pathways, normal tissue reactions, QA in radiotherapy and nutrition. He is the organiser of several scientifical meetings and teaching courses and has held chairmanships and board memberships of a wide range of scientifical and administrative national and international committees, chairing national clinical guidelines in head and neck cancer for the Danish National Board of Health since 2007. Jørgen is also Chairman of The Danish Head and Neck Cancer Group (DAHANCA) since 2006. Associate Professor Johansen has participated in national and international clinical and experimental trials in radiotherapy as principal investigator or coinvestigator for more than 30 years. He also has over 130 peer-reviewed publications, more than 200 national and international abstracts/presentations and 150 scientific papers for 15 different international journals.

Professor Clark AM is the inaugural Lang Walker Family Foundation Conjoint Professor and Chair in Head and Neck Cancer Reconstructive

Surgery at the University of Sydney and Chris O'Brien Lifehouse, the Director of Head and Neck Cancer Research at Chris O'Brien Lifehouse. and the Director of Translational Research at the Royal Prince Alfred Institute of Academic Surgery. Professor Clark is a leading academic head and neck cancer surgeon with over 350 publications and \$32M in competitive and philanthropic research funding. He leads the Cancer Institute NSW funded Head and Neck Cancer Translational Research Program across ten hospitals and medical research institutes. This program is dedicated to developing novel technology-driven therapies, biomarkers and advanced reconstructive techniques that minimise the disease- and treatment-related morbidity of oral cancer and metastatic cutaneous squamous cell cancer. In recognition of his contributions to head and neck surgery he has been made a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) and an Honorary Member of the Australian Society of Otolaryngology Head and Neck Surgery (ASOHNS).



Several points require emphasis:

- 1. Authors of research papers who wish to have their abstracts considered for inclusion in the program at the ANZHNCS ASM 2023 must submit their abstract electronically via the meeting website adhering to the submission deadline. Abstracts submitted after the closing date will not be considered.
- 2. Abstract submission is entirely online and paper or facsimile copies will not be accepted. Abstracts will not be submitted by meeting staff on behalf of authors.
- 3. The title should be brief and explicit.
- 4. Research papers should follow the format: Purpose, Methodology, Results and Conclusion.
- 5. Abstracts should not exceed 275 words (excluding the title, author(s) and presenters' name). Any references must be included in this allowance. If you exceed this limit, the excess text will NOT appear in the final program.
- 6. Include author(s) and indicate presenting author.
- 7. Include details of main institution.
- 8. Abbreviations should be used only for common terms. For uncommon terms, the abbreviation should be given in brackets after the first full use of the word.
- 9. Presentations (slide and video) will only have electronic PowerPoint support. Audio visual instructions will be included in the correspondence sent to all successful authors.
- 10. A 50 word CV is required from each presenter to facilitate their introduction by the session chair.
- 11. The timing (presentation and discussion) of all papers is at the discretion of the organising committee.
- 12. Tables, diagrams, graphs, etc CANNOT be accepted in the abstract submission. This is due to the limitations of the computer software program.
- 13. Please do not type in your abstract onto the submission page. Being internet based, each page on the submission site can only be open for 15 minutes before closing. Type your submission on a text document (eg. Microsoft Word) and copy and paste it into the abstract text field.
- 14. Authors must be registrants at the meeting to present and for their abstract to appear in the final program and on the meeting website.

Call for Abstracts (cont'd)

The submitting author of an abstract will ALWAYS receive email confirmation of receipt of the abstract into the submission site. If you do not receive a confirmation email within 24 hours it may mean the abstract has not been received. In this circumstance, please email anzhncs.asm@surgeons.org to determine why a confirmation email has not been received.

Important Note Regarding Disclosure of Potential Conflict of Interest

ANZHNCS policy requires disclosure of all financial relationships between a speaker and the commercial supporter (if applicable) or with the manufacturer of any product or class of products they plan to discuss. This policy is designed to provide the audience with an opportunity to review any affiliations between a speaker and supporting organisations for the purpose of determining the potential presence of bias or influence over content.

This policy is not intended to prevent a speaker with such an affiliation or relationship from participating.

Disclosure should be made using a slide at the beginning of your presentation.

Examples of relationships which should be disclosed include but are not limited to:

- any direct financial interest in a company whose interests are in the area(s) covered by the educational material
- investments held by the speaker in a relevant company membership on a relevant company's advisory board or similar committee
- current or recent participation in a clinical trial sponsored by a relevant company
- assisting in the design of clinical studies concerning the use of products manufactured by a relevant company
- · participating in clinical studies using products produced by a relevant company
- research by the speaker sponsored by a relevant company
- paid speaker by a relevant company
- the speaker holds a patent for a product referred to in the presentation or marketed by a
