Pharmacological Treatment of Osteoporosis

- Risks and Benefits

The aging population in Singapore is expected to rise from 26.5 % in 2020 to 39.6% in 2050. Osteoporosis affects 1 in 3 women and 1 in 5 men in their lifetime. Studies have also shown that Singaporeans live longer, with at least 20% suffering from disability associated with musculoskeletal disorders. With medical treatment of osteoporosis and fall prevention, the risk of future fractures can be reduced by up to 80%. However, as with any treatment, there are concerns regarding potential adverse effects, no matter how rare. This talk aims to update clinicians in the current available treatment options for osteoporosis, with evidence on their efficacy and potential adverse effects. There will be a focus on data in medication-related osteonecrosis of the jaw and a discussion on weighing the risks and benefit of osteoporosis treatments.



Dr Linsey Gani is a Consultant at the Department of Endocrinology, Changi General Hospital, Singapore. She is the program director for the Eastern Community Health Outreach (ECHO) in Singapore, working to provide chronic disease health screening to the Eastern region in Singapore. She has also set up the Osteoporosis Liaison Service in Changi General Hospital to provide secondary fracture prevention to patients admitted with fragility hip fractures. She currently holds a Clinical Senior Lecturer position in the Department of Medicine, Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, National University of Singapore ("NUS Medicine"). Dr Gani graduated from the University of Melbourne and is an accredited endocrinologist and a fellow of the Royal Australian College of Physicians. She has completed a Masters of Public Health in health care management and public policy at the Harvard School of Public Health. Her areas of interest include diabetes, metabolic bone diseases, chronic disease management, public policy and health care models.
