1000 Waterfall Swim & Visit at Moline, Kakadu National Park

Hike and swim is optional.

Travel south along the Stuart Highway and enter Kakadu via the southern entrance (3hrs). The first stop in Kakadu will be Moline Rockhole, a special permit area in which only a few select operators are permitted to access; guaranteeing minimal crowds. The small waterfall and waterhole below the falls are a great place to cool down and relax. Here, your guide will give you a pair of snorkels so you can explore the underwater world, home to a variety of species such as fish and turtle. (10:00am – 11:00am)

1200 Picnic Lunch, Waterfall Swim & Visit – Maguk (Barramundi Gorge), Kakadu National Park

Hike and swim is optional.

Travel to Maguk (Barramundi Gorge) (1hr) and stop for a picnic lunch (12:00pm – 1:00pm). Enjoy a scenic 1km walk along the edge of Barramundi Creek before arriving at the base of Barramundi Falls. Swim or snorkel in the large plunge pool below the falls and discover an array of aquatic life. (1:00pm – 3:00pm)

1630 Tour commences – Yellow Water Cruise with Kakadu Tourism



A Yellow Water cruise is a 'must do' experience when visiting Kakadu. Enjoy a relaxing two hour cruise on a tranquil and land locked billabong fringed by pandanus, bamboo, paperbark, and monsoon rainforest. The cruise provides a good environment to see a variety of birdlife and perhaps a saltwater crocodile.

0800 Drive to Gunbalanya, Arnhem Land

After breakfast (7:00am – 8:00am), travel from Cooinda to the northern region of Kakadu National Park to Cahill's Crossing on the East Alligator River, and enter Arnhem Land. (1hr) A 15 km scenic drive to the Gunbalanya Aboriginal community provides some of the best driving views in the Top End, with floodplains covered in bird life and water lilies running up alongside the Arnhem Land escarpment.

0900 Visit - Injalak Arts Centre

Upon arrival at Gunbalanya visit the renowned Injalak Arts and Craft Centre. Meet and watch traditional local artists in action before departing with an Aboriginal guide to be shown around the Injalak Hill rock art sites. Spend the morning experiencing some of the best Aboriginal rock art in Australia. The area is home to a unique style of 'x-ray art' dating back many thousands of

years. Listen to ancient dreamtime stories and learn more about Indigenous culture in the heart of Arnhem Land from your local guide. (9:00am – 1:00pm)

0930 Visit – Injalak Hill

Injalak Arts Centre overlooks the breathtaking Injalak Hill, a superb sandstone monolith rich with traditional rock art and stories of the Indigenous people who have lived in the area for thousands of years. Visitors travel to Gunbalanya from all over the world to visit Injalak Hill and experience its outstanding rock art galleries. With panoramic views of the surrounding countryside, Injalak Hill is a must-see during your visit to West Arnhem Land. Tours of the hill can be arranged through our partners.

1300 Picnic Lunch by Venture North

1400 Drive & Visit - Garig Ganuk Barlu National Park

Continue to the most northern tip of Arnhem Land, the Cobourg Peninsula, part of the Garig Gunak Barlu National Park. The drive takes approximately 3-4 hrs, with stops and creek crossings. Garig Gunak Barlu National Park (Cobourg Peninsula) includes the surrounding waters of the Arafura Sea and Van Diemen Gulf, and some of the neighbouring islands. Discover a mosaic of sandy beaches, dunes and associated coastal grasslands, mangroves, rainforest patches, swamps, lagoons, coral reefs, sea grass meadows and rich marine life in this 4,500 square kilometre paradise.

Garig Gunak Barlu National Park (Cobourg Peninsula)

1700 Arrive at Cobourg

Upon arriving at Cobourg (5:00pm), head straight to Venture North's private camp, and be greeted by the resident camp host and served nibbles on the cliff top. Relax as the sun sets over Port Essington. (Sunset 6:30pm)

1900 Dinner under the stars

Dinner will be prepared in the camp kitchen this evening and will incorporate a variety of premium NT produce and bush ingredients. (7:00pm)

Overnight: Cobourg Coastal Camp (Permanent Safari Tent)



0730 Breakfast in-house

Awake to the sound of birds and enjoy a special 'Cobourg-style' cooked breakfast (7:30am-8:30am)

0930 Tour commences – Victoria Settlement Historic Site & Marine Tour

Explore the Northern Territory's largest Marine Park by boat. Cobourg is abundant in some amazing marine life, including six of the seven species of marine turtle, manta rays, dolphins, sharks, crocodiles, mud crabs and plenty of fish. As we cruise the Marine Park, we will stop and visit the Victoria Settlement ruins. Established prior to Darwin as a military outpost by the British, this site represents the third failed attempt at settlement in Northern Australia. After surviving for 11 years between 1838 and 1849, it was abandoned. However, stone ruins still stand on the shoreline of Port Essington and serve as a reminder of the hardships faced by the early colonists. (9:30am-11:30am)

1230 Lunch

1330 Tour commences – Fishing Activity

This afternoon we try our luck at fishing. With more than 250 species of fish and over 2000sq km of Marine Park to explore, Cobourg is an idyllic fishing destination. The Parks diversity of marine environments means plenty of fishing options. Spend 3 hours fishing for some of the NT's most famous fish such as golden snapper, giant trevally, coral trout and Spanish mackerel. For those more adventurous, try your hand at catching a big shark! (1:30pm-4:30pm) Return to camp late afternoon, and explore the nearby beaches and creek systems, or simply enjoy the solitude while reading a book from a hammock overlooking the ocean.

1900 Seafood Dinner – freshly caught at Cobourg Coastal Camp

Tonight enjoy a freshly caught seafood dinner prepared in the camp kitchen (7:00pm)

Overnight: Cobourg Coastal Camp (Permanent Safari Tent)

Saturday, 25th May

0730 Breakfast in-house

Awake to the sound of birds and enjoy a special 'Cobourg-style' cooked breakfast (7:30am-8:30am)

0830 4WD Tour & Explore – Turtle Nesting Area

Cobourg is home to the first RAMSAR wetland (wetlands of international importance) in the world, with freshwater paperbark swamps and billabongs 100m from the coastline.

Explore the northern beaches, commonly used as turtle nesting areas and covered in a wide range of shells. Low tide provides opportunities to explore exposed coral reefs and rock pools, home to various marine life. Enjoy a beachside picnic lunch (11:30pm-12:30pm)
