
He holds a PhD in Development Anthropology and Master's in Public Administration from Syracuse University, USA and a Management degree from Indian Institute of Forestry Management, India.

Prior to joining IFAD, Romina worked for FAO where she worked on agrobiodiversity and on Climate Smart Agriculture.


