

'Automatic Headlights On' (AHO) for powered two-wheelers

THE ADOPTION OF 'AUTOMATIC HEADLIGHTS ON' (AHO) FEATURE FOR PTWS IN INDIA




SRF worked closely with SIAM and the Ministry of Road Transport & Highways in New Delhi to bring about the early introduction of AHO in India for all Powered-Two-Wheelers (PTWs).





AHO – a reality in India from 1 April 2017! 25 million bikes a year will be manufactured with this mandatory feature





AHO – a reality in Taiwan from 1 January 2017!





AHO – a reality in Colombia from 1 January 2022!

CAMPAIGN 2

'Anti-lock Braking System' (ABS)



ABS for PTWS - Worldwide

SRF is calling for ABS to be fitted (as a minimum) to the front wheel of every powered two-wheeler that has a maximum design speed in excess of 50kph. This is vital as in many parts of Asia motorcycles with 50cc, 70cc, 90cc and 110cc engines are used. To save lives in significant numbers, it is essential that countries adopt ABS for ALL machines which have speeds of 50kph or more. Only fitting ABS to models over 125cc would result in very little meaningful change as they only constitute a relatively small percentage of the total number of PTWs sold.

ABS NEEDS TO BE ON ALL PTWS

Some countries, for example Thailand and Malaysia, have introduced legislation making ABS mandatory for motorcycles over 125cc.

This is positive, although the key issue is addressing motorcycles of 125cc and below, with a design speed of 50kp/h or more (or 50cc), as this is the majority of the population of PTWs.

It is critically important that the feature is fitted during manufacture to the lower powered machines which would have the greatest impact on reducing fatalities and serious injuries.



ABS - South East Asia



Policymakers are urged to seize, without delay, the opportunity to mandate ABS which would save 40,000 lives in the first five years!

Chiangmai Trial - 'Helmet Wearing Enforcement Cameras' providing overwhelming evidence on their value

Working in collaboration with Dr Theerawood Gomutbutra and the Chiangmai Road Safety Committee




Approximately 250 fatalities <u>every</u> year in the five districts

 Two-thirds of motorcycle fatalities occur at night – riders do not wear helmets as no police on street




Report System (Off-Line Version)

In January 2022, at 5 main intersections, wearing helmets in the daytime was over 90%.





Night-time 'before' and 'after' showing dramatic increase in helmet wearing.



In first 6 months, 62 lives saved


In second 6 months, only 30 lives saved due to withdrawal of funding for police enforcement
