

Syed Husain Quadri is currently the Director of the Resilience and Climate Action Department at the Islamic Development Bank.

He is leading its engagement in diverse thematic areas of Climate Change, Fragility, Conflict, Disaster Management, CSOs, and Gender and Youth Development in 57 Member Countries. He is chiefly responsible for leading an accomplished team of experts that develop and implement thematic policies, and financing strategies and deliver advisory and capacity development initiatives.

In addition, he is also the Head of the Global Muslim Philanthropy Fund for Children with UNICEF. Quadri also leads the oversight of the Banks COVID response program and is the Deputy Chair for the Banks Operations Technical Committee.
