Road Traffic Authority (RTA)


- In recent years the government enacted RTA Act merging several legislations and one of them is NRSC Act. That is how the functions of NRSC were inherited by RTA.

Road Safety Situation in PNG

- About 300-500 people die each year in PNG alone as recorded by Traffic Police and Road Traffic Authority (RTA) Accident Data Base
- The trend of Road Accident is always increasing each year.
- The most common Age range is between 15-49 years, which is the cream of the population, the very active people are dying from Road Accident.
- The major cause is drinking and driving coupling up with speeding.
- The larger portion of victims is Pedestrians, all ages.
- Children make up the large percentage of the people who die in the road crashes.

Figure 1.1 Fatal and Serious Injury Pedestrian Casualties (2010-2014)





Figure E1 Killed and Seriously Injured Road Users by Year (Trend Line shown in Red)




Mandated Responsibilities

Area of Investment-Collaboration Required

- Capacity Building training the local road safety officers and road safety engineers.
- 2019-2020, a Road Safety Consultant was engaged by RTA through ADB funding. One of the ToR was to develop a Road Safety Strategy (RSS). The consultant did the draft with 5 years Action Plans, mostly consultation work, with other stakeholders, and it stresses up to 20 Years Action Plans, draft available.

Area of Collaboration and funding

- 1.A Road Safety Consultant.
- 2. Road Safety Teachers Resource Book. (Printing Distribution, & Training of Teachers for implementation (teaching)
- 3. Development of Road Transport Management System (ICT) for vehicle Registration & Driver Licensing. This will also compliment the driver testing both theory and practical. It will roll it out to all provinces.
