



Bert Hunter is Chief Investment Officer of CT Green Bank – the nation’s first state-level green bank. Since 2012, Mr. Hunter leads a team that develops innovative financing programs that have deployed \$2.2 billion in public and private investment in energy efficiency and renewable energy using approximately \$300 million of public resources. As of 2021, its remit has expanded to include Environmental Infrastructure. Mr. Hunter and his team have developed several successful sustainability financing programs, including the Smart-E residential energy efficiency loan with a network of banks, a small business energy loan with the state’s largest electric utility, a solar PV program for public buildings (including schools), and a Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy (C-PACE) program. He has also led the development of the Green Liberty Bonds and Green Liberty Notes program which allows ordinary investors to support Green Bank initiatives for as little as \$100 via a “crowd funding” mechanism.

Prior to joining the Green Bank, Mr. Hunter was CFO and Chief Risk Officer of Spectrum Capital, Ltd, an investment banking JV with MUFG focused on commercial aircraft finance and investment in U.S. electric power generation. Prior to Spectrum, Mr. Hunter was the treasurer of the international leasing company of Chemical Bank (now JPMorgan Chase), where he managed the funding for a billion-dollar diversified portfolio of equipment loans and leases in more than a dozen countries outside the United States.

Mr. Hunter received his MBA from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania and is an alumnus and former Trustee of Wake Forest University.
