Shiulie Ghosh is an award-winning journalist and TV anchor and has worked for some of best-known names in the news industry including the BBC, ITV, TRT World and Aljazeera. As one of the main faces of Aljazeera English, she launched the international channel in Qatar in 2006, and over the next decade helped it expand to over 100 countries. In a career spanning more than thirty years, Shiulie has covered some of the world's top stories and interviewed decision-makers and global leaders. She is also the owner and director of a media services company, Aero Productions Ltd. As a professional moderator, Shiulie has chaired high-level events for organisations including the UN and the WHO, and hosted conferences for industries as diverse as pharmaceuticals, health, agriculture, construction and finance.

Qingfeng Zhang, Chief, Rural Development and Food Security (Agriculture) Thematic Group; Concurrently, OIC, Chief, Environment Thematic Group, Sustainable Development and Climate Change Department, Asian Development Bank

Mr. Zhang is providing leadership to the formulation and implementation of the Bank's strategy and knowledge in agriculture, natural resources and food, oversees the operationalization of the Bank's vision on agriculture, natural resources and food in regional and country programs. Each year the Rural Development, Natural Resources and Food has \$3-4 billion investment across the Bank (investments, results-based lending and policy-based lending). There are about 135 staffs in this sector across the Bank.

During his last 16 years with the Bank, Mr. Zhang processes and administers loan and technical assistance projects in green agricultural value chain, efficient use of natural resources (land, soil, water as well as agricultural wastes), climate resilient agriculture, rural renewable biomass energy, healthy agriculture-ecosystems, food safety, and internet plus agriculture. He published over dozens of knowledge products, Opeds and blogs on agriculture, natural resources and environment. Prior to serving as this role, Mr. Zhang was the Director for Environment, Natural Resources and Agriculture in East Asia Department in the Bank for which report to this Prior to joining ADB, he was a Senior Environment Specialist at the World Bank in Washington; a Director at the State Environmental Protection Administration in Beijing; and a Research Fellow at the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology.

Mr. Zhang is a Chinese national. He holds a doctoral degree in environmental engineering from the Tsinghua University; and a master's degree in water resources management, and a bachelor's degree in hydrology from the Sichuan University. He was also trained at the Harvard Business School through its Executive Development Program.

Roberta Casali is the Vice President, Finance and Risk Management at the Asian Development Bank. She has more than 30 years of executive experience in central banking and the financial sector. She held senior positions in the area of payment systems at the Bank of Italy, in both national and international roles. She also had significant private sector banking experience, including more than 10 years at leading Italian international banking group Intesa Sanpaolo SpA. From 2017 to 2021 she served on a number of boards of listed and private companies as an independent chair and non-executive director. He served as ADB's Chief of Water Sector Group from 2017-20, Afghanistan Country Director from 2014-17, and joined ADB in 2003. Paul Teng, Managing Director & Dean, NIE International Pte Ltd | Nanyang Technological University, Singapore

Professor Teng is Adjunct Senior Fellow, Centre for Non-Traditional Security Studies, Nanyang Technological University Singapore and concurrently Managing Director, NIE International Pte. Ltd. He is also Senior Adviser (AgriFood) to A*STAR Singapore. Paul previously held leadership positions in the Worldfish Centre, the International Rice Research Institute, Monsanto Company and U.S. universities. Professor Paul Teng is experienced in tropical agrifood systems and food security. He has researched and taught in North America, Africa and Asia, and has published eleven books and over 240 papers. Paul has been recognized for his work through the Eriksson Prize in Plant Pathology, election as Fellow of The World Academy of Sciences

and by professional societies, and conferred an Honorary D.Sc. from Murdoch University, Australia. Professor Teng is also adviser to several startups in the agritech space.
