



Trail bridge program: Mainstreaming GESI





Policy level: - "Gender Responsive"

- Incremental changes more readily accepted by GoN
- Projects can influence policies when demonstrated with tangible outputs

Implementation level: - "Gender Aware"

- Gender provisions institutionalized
- Numbers v Empowerment
- Women's unpaid Care work limits involvement facilitation required

Trail bridges: Last mile access and connectivity





1 million people use TBs daily Majority of the users are women

- 52% users were women (ADTC)



TBs reduces daily drudgery and **affords dignity** to women while carrying out household chores

- 51% users cross for HH chores



2.1 hours saved for 2-way journey



Easier for pregnant women to receive Ante Natal Care

- 31% rise in patients seeking treatment from health facilities



Students attention and attendance increase

- 8.5% rise in students attendance



Markets are closer

- 17% decrease in provide of goods
