Alexandra led the development of ADB's Climate Change Action Plan and is the coordinator for the plans' implementation. She provides strategic support in the implementation of ADB's climate change agenda across regional departments and resident missions ensuring the integration of climate change into ADB operations and enabling support to ADB's developing member countries in enhancing their climate agendas.

Alexandra started her ADB career in 2012 as an Urban Development Specialist negotiating and implementing the Urban Climate Change Resilience Trust Fund. In 2015 she moved to operations and where she successfully processed and implemented urban and water investments in Bangladesh, India, and Nepal. In 2020 she moved to SPD where she was focal for several ADB financing modalities and the review of ADB's technical assistance. She also supported the development of ADB policies and the coordination among the heads of multilateral development banks. In October 2022 she joined CCSD.

Alexandra has about 25 years of professional experience in development, strategic planning, project management, capacity development, with specialization on integrated urban development, urban resilience and climate change.

Prior to ADB, Alexandra was Managing Director of the City of Vienna's urban innovations competence center, which also served as Smart City Agency and UN-HABITAT Best Practices Hub. She worked with both the private sector and state-owned enterprise on urban infrastructure projects and capacity development programs and advised cities in Europe and the Middle East on integrated and sustainable urban strategies and technologies.

Alexandra is Austrian. She holds a Master of Engineering degree in urban and regional planning from the Vienna Technical University and a Master of Science degree in urban strategies from the Vienna University of Applied Arts. She is also a fellow of the Social Innovation Program by the Rockefeller Foundation and the University of Waterloo.
