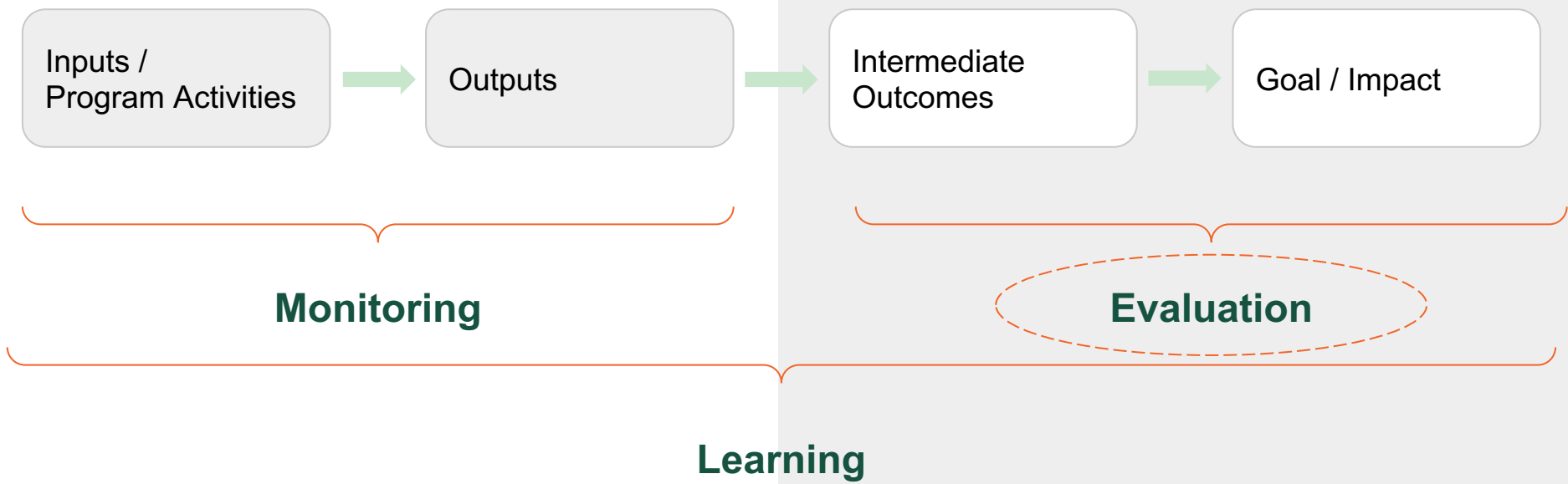

POLICY QUESTION

What is the impact of sustainable livelihood promotion on child labor in the Philippines?

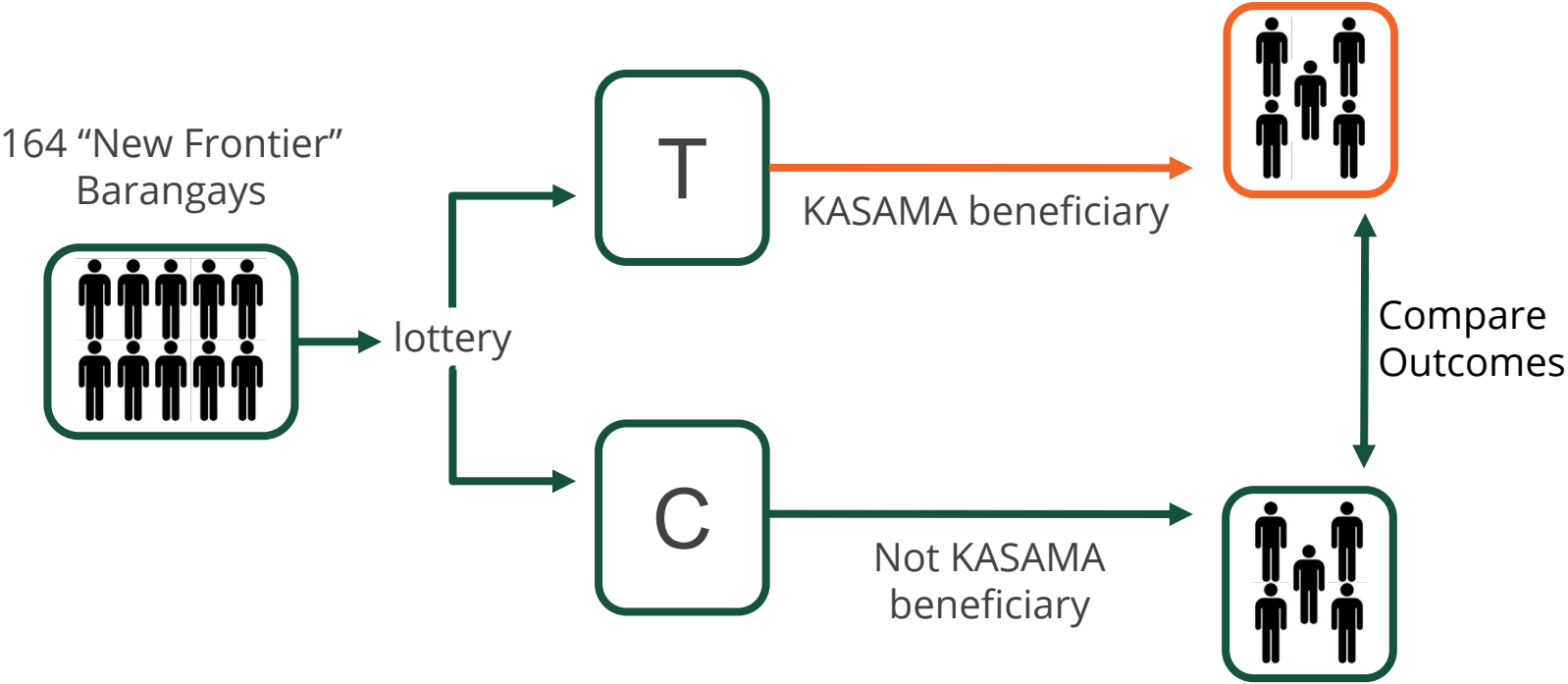
INTERVENTION

- DOLE's KASAMA targets poor HH with child laborers
- One-time asset transfer worth PHP 10,000
- Entrepreneurship Training
- Child Labor orientation

OUTCOME MEASURES

1. Livelihood Generation
2. Standard of Living
3. Child Labor

Design: Randomised Control Trial



Findings



Livelihoods: More likely to start new businesses and preserve existing businesses



Economic well-being: Food security improves, consumption increases, business income increases



Child welfare: Increased on average, driven by changes in life satisfaction, concentrated among children already in child labor

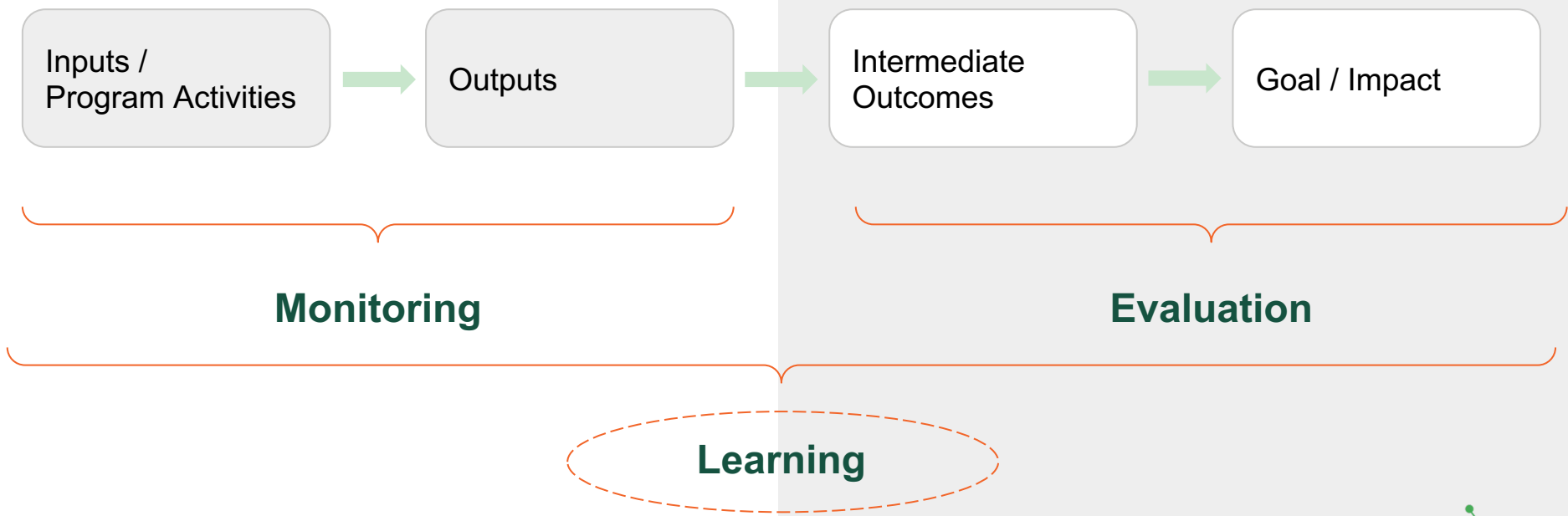


Child labor: There was no overall effect on primary or secondary measures of child labor.

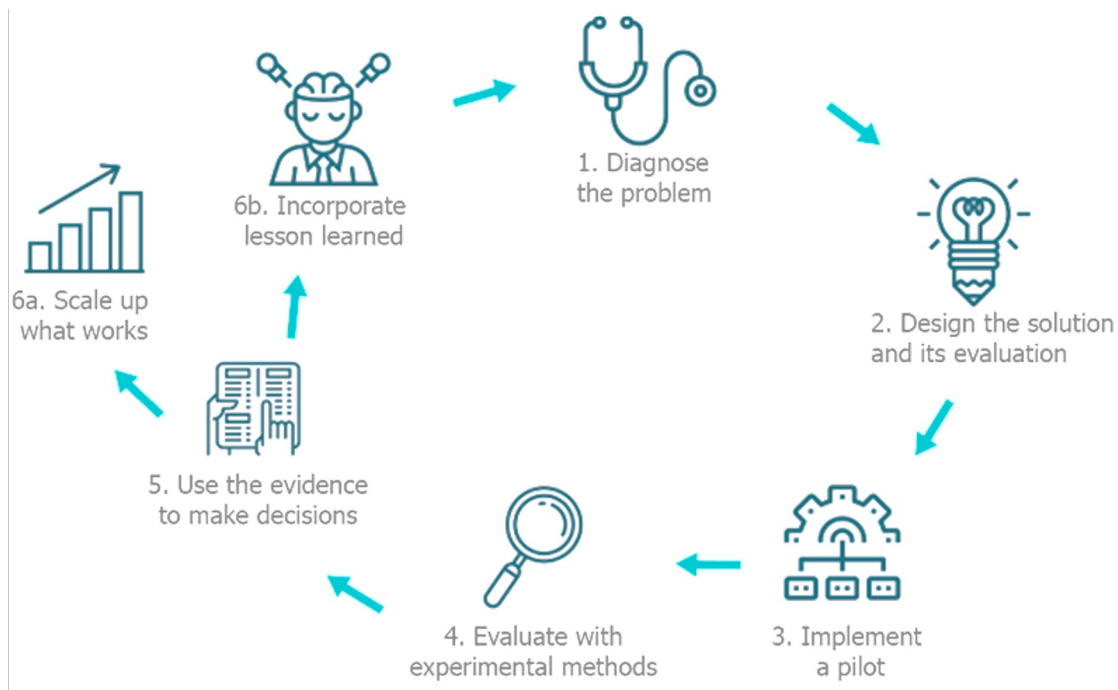

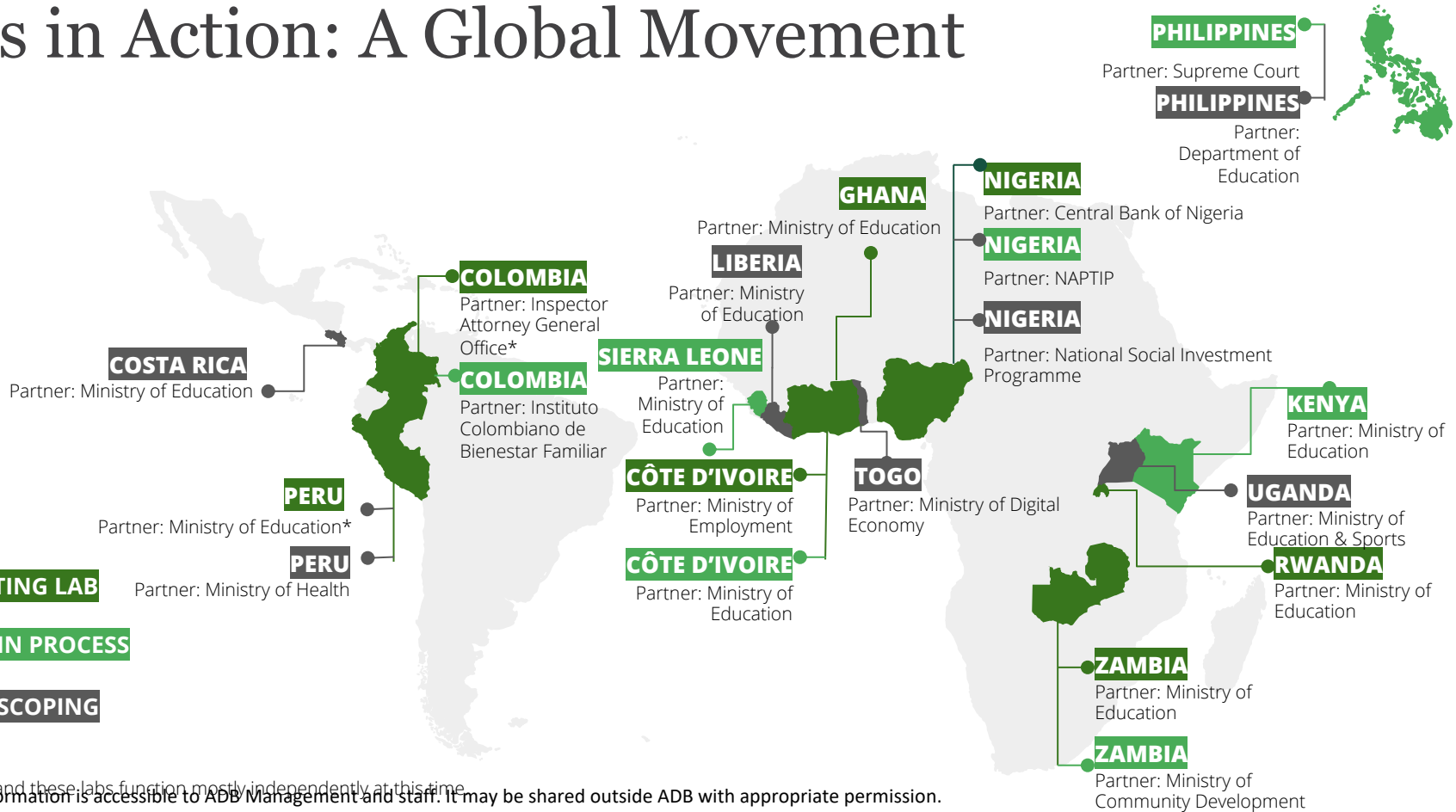


MineduLAB in Peru



- Designs, evaluates, and implements **low-cost innovations** using **Ministry's own administrative data**
- In years 1-2, IPA and J-PAL provided **technical assistance**:
 - mapped existing administrative data
 - identified existing policies to run low-cost improvements
 - developed proposals for implementation and research
- Since 2016, completed 10 innovations with results; **3 innovations scaled-up to public policy**
- MineduLAB now **fully institutionalized** at the Ministry of Education in Peru
