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RITUAL

"Ritual is, above all, an assertion of difference."

•Ritual creates a space that is extraordinary, that is set apart as essentially different from normal life.

•That space is made different by symbolic acts and spatial configurations and by bringing people together for a deliberate social activity.

•Restorative Justice is a ritual.

Hostility




Previous research in the RJ field has asked:

 - Victim satisfaction








"<u>How</u> does restorative justice work?"

FUNCTIONS OF RITUAL



Provide a sense of security, legitimacy and authority through establishing a set way of doing things

- Respond to societal concerns
- Reaffirm communal values
- Maintain stability and cohesion

NORMATIVE RITUALS

THE NORMATIVE FUNCTION OF THE COURT RITUAL

- •Responds to societal concern for predictability and trustworthiness
- •Establishes and reaffirms social values
- Maintains stability and cohesion



 Lead to significant and lasting personal and relational change
Facilitate a deeper connection that may lead to a change in opinion or behavior





TRANSFORMATIVE SHORTCOMINGS OF COURT RITUAL




•Top down nature of sentencing ritual contradicts the equality necessary to invoke the liminal state or collective effervescence present in transformative rituals.

•Offenders are often vilified and face "stigmatizing shame."

•The stigmatizing symbolism of the court system often leads to the continuation of criminal behavior.



THE TRANSFORMATIVE FUNCTION OF THE RJ RITUAL



"Where there is a kind of magic, or if that is not a good word, where there is a kind of connection between human people from wherever they are from, whatever their culture looks like, as we know, outstanding stuff can happen. It is because they have been given a space for them to connect with each other and our role is to help provide that space. And what happens, and the value we see all the time, is just because in a way that traditional justice doesn't do, restorative justice allows them to connect at that human level."

CONTRIBUTION

- •Ritual considerations need to be taken into account lest the transformative impact of restorative justice be compromised through modification.
- •Concrete recommendation of ideal ritual structure for facilitators and policy makers in order to extend and improve practice.
