DISASTER MANAGEMENT IMAGING - FACILITATING THE FUTURE FOR ADF RADIOLOGY

Lieutenant Lachlan Roberts is an Australian Army Radiographer posted to the 2nd General Health Battalion. He graduated from Queensland University of Technology with a Bachelor of Medical Imaging Technology in 2016. He has deployed overseas and domestic as a sole Radiographer to Toomelah (NSW) in 2017 for the Army Aboriginal Community Assistance Programme; Iraq in 2018 for Operation Okra – Task Group Taji VII; and most recently, Christmas Island and Howard Springs in 2020 for the whole of government response to COVID-19. He is proud to be a part of the Army radiography team and providing necessary medical support to ADF operations and disaster areas.

Wing Commander John Magnussen is the ADF Radiation Medical Practitioner, and is Professor of Radiology at Macquarie University. He is a diagnostic and interventional radiologist with a PhD in Biomedical Engineering and has worked in multiple public and private hospitals. He has published more than 130 articles, abstracts and books chapters on subjects ranging from basic science to clinical research, from medical, biological sciences and archaeology. His work has been supported by more than \$22M in grants. He has a strong interest in the provision of medical imaging in the deployed environment.
