

# MIHI 501 ANZCA

## APPLICATION OF THE HUI PROCESS/MEIHANA MODEL TO THE AUSTRALIAN AND NEW ZEALAND COLLEGE OF ANAESTHETISTS.

The objective of the course is to support health practitioners to feel informed and confident in the development of Hauora Māori competencies, specially focussing on the application of the Hui Process and Meihana Model. The course is tailored to assist learners in applying these models within their clinical practice alongside Māori patients and/or whānau. These models promote positive engagement, appropriate care/treatment and health advocacy that support Māori health equity. It is expected that the course will take learners between 22-28 hours in total, to complete (Online and On-site)

### IT IS EXPECTED THAT ALL LEARNERS WILL COMPLETE:

#### ON-LINE LEARNING MODULES

(Live from May 2021)

Online modules that support learners to explore the context of Hauora Māori in 2021;

- Te Reo within a clinical setting.
- Understanding the context for studying Māori Health.
- Orientation to Hui Process and Meihana Model.
- How the application of Hui Process/Meihana Model can help us reduce clinical bias and improve health literacy.
- The role of Whakatere

*Each module takes approximately 2 hours to complete. Each module has written material, a video and quizzes attached. These Modules must be completed **2 weeks prior to the on-site training.***

#### ON-SITE TRAINING SEMINAR

(1st November 2021)

One on-site training seminar in Christchurch inclusive of;

- Team based learning activities to orientate learners to the Hui Process and Meihana Model.
- Simulated patient sessions to practice application of Hui Process and Meihana Model to clinical practice.

*Approximately 8 hours (8.30am – 5pm). Attendance and engagement in all sessions is required.*

### ASSESSMENT MODULES

The course includes an assessment component. This provides an opportunity for learners to demonstrate their ability to utilise the Hui Process and Meihana Model in clinical practice.

- Assessment 1; Complete a case assignment, which involves a virtual patient case and allows the learner to demonstrate how they apply the Hui Process/ Meihana Model (2 hours). Once this case assignment meets the pass criteria the learners will be awarded MIHI501 RACS: Application of Hui Process/ Meihana Model to Clinical Practice.
- Assessment 2; If the learner chooses to continue their learning they can complete an additional written case assignment. This involves interviewing a Māori patient from the learners practice, and completing the assignment as dictated by a template provided (6 hours). Once this case assignment meets the pass criteria the learners will be awarded MIHI501 RACS: Application of Hui Process/ Meihana Model to Clinical Practice. with DISTINCTION.

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
