#### Why Am I Left out of Critical Conversations?

PMI recently published its 2022 Jobs Report (<u>you can read it here</u>). There's a lot of great insight, but I want to focus on just one set of data in the section on "Demand and Rewards for Project Talent." That data set is the five top skills and capabilities for project managers:

- Relationship building
- Collaborative leadership
- Strategic thinking
- Creative problem solving
- Commercial awareness

That last one was described by PMI as "knowledge of the business, industry and ecosystem, along with their implications for projects. "I'm guessing that none of you are particularly surprised to see the first item on the list. #### <u>The Importance of Kindness</u> <u>for Project Managers and</u> <u>Teams</u>

Kindness can be a tricky topic in the business world. If you look online, you'll see multiple articles written about this theme. One of the challenges of incorporating kindness into the workplace is that there are many different views on being kind. Everyone defines kindness based on personal experiences and belief systems. Kindness, for some, may include a bonus or gifts. In comparison, others may view kindness as helping or getting a note of thanks. Because of these differences, kindness in one team may look different than kindness in another. You might see kindness in a team member with a gruff demeanor appear as taking time to check in on how each team member is getting along. 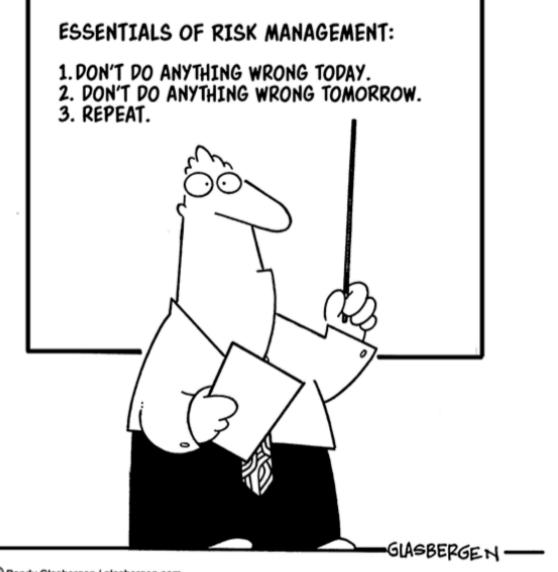

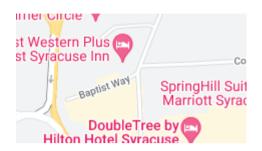
