Faculty Begin...

1. Course identified for teaching online
2. Connected with an Instructional Designer

Role of the Instructional Designer (ID)

- Functions as project manager and ID
 - Utilize PM principles to support faculty course development
 - Development schedule which outlines timeline and deliverables
 - Provides LMS support
 - Provides pedagogical support

Oswego's Course Development Process

- Course development agreement
- Kickoff meeting
 - Most important question in this meeting: What is your vision, idea, for your course? What would you like to do?
 - Most important statement in this meeting: You are the subject matter expert.
- Detailed development schedule which provides milestones
 - Provides due dates and milestones
- Final course review
