

CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION

The University of Tennessee Health Science Center Division of Surgical Oncology is hosting a one-day symposium on the management of endocrine tumors. The purpose of this activity is to educate healthcare providers on up-to-date strategies for the evaluation and management of patients with thyroid, parathyroid, and adrenal neoplasms. The symposium will provide a unique opportunity for clinicians involved in the care of these patients to learn from and interact with leading national and local faculty to increase clinical knowledge, apply new data into practice, and ultimately improve patient outcomes.

OBJECTIVES

- Understand the role of molecular diagnostics in the evaluation and management of thyroid nodules
- Review the appropriate surgical management for well differentiated and medullary thyroid carcinoma
- Understand systemic therapy options for patients with advanced thyroid cancer
- Appreciate the radiographic evaluation of patients with primary hyperparathyroidism and the role of surgical therapy for these patients
- Discuss the evaluation and management for patients with functional, non-functional, benign and malignant adrenal tumors.
