




# Integrated Preparedness Planning (IPP)



## The IPP


The document will consist of program priorities, agencies responsible, and timeline for completion. The document highlights the preparedness cycle of Emergency Management, by define the risk, creating a plan to mitigate, train towards the planning goals and then exercise it using local agency organization and equipment. The IPP establishes priorities and goals that will guide the county efforts to build, improve, and sustain capabilities across a broad range of mission areas.

# State of Wisconsin Threats Identified (2020)

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Below are the threats, hazards, and risks areas ranked by our partners:

1. Severe ice storm followed by extreme cold
2. Cyber-attack causing widespread power outages
3. Extensive wide area flooding
4. EF4 Tornado striking a populated area
5. Statewide flu pandemic
6. Hazardous Materials release in a densely populated area
7. Agro-terrorism
8. A coordinated terrorist attacks
9. Bluff Failures due to storm erosion on the highly populated areas along Lake Michigan
10. 100,000-acre wildfire
11. Radiological release from a Nuclear Power Plant
12. Drought and unusually high temperatures

*\*Additional hazards identified but not included in the ranking in order: Civil Unrest, Widespread supply chain disturbance of life-sustaining materials, active threat/school recovery, smaller wildland fire requiring evacuation, Tornado less than EF4, Derecho, Electromagnetic Pulse, Fuel Distribution*


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# Supporting Capabilities

POETE Areas	
<b>Planning</b>	Development of policies, plans, procedures, mutual aid agreements, strategies, and other publications; also involves the collection and analysis of intelligence and information
<b>Organization</b>	Individual teams, an overall organizational structure, and leadership at each level in the structure
<b>Equipment</b>	Equipment, supplies, and systems that comply with relevant standards
<b>Training</b>	Content and methods of delivery that comply with relevant training standards
<b>Exercises</b>	Exercises and actual incidents that provide an opportunity to demonstrate, evaluate, and improve the ability of core capabilities to perform assigned missions and tasks to standards


