

- SMPAG, Ad Hoc Legal Working Group Report
- States are Liable for Damages, severally and jointly

International (Private) Actors?

"Each State Party to the Treaty that launches or procures the launching of an object into outer space, including the moon and other celestial bodies, and each State Party from whose territory or facility an object is launched, is **internationally liable** for damage to another State Party to the Treaty or to its natural or juridical persons by such object or its component parts on the Earth, in air or in outer space, including the moon and other celestial bodies." Article VII of the Outer Space Treaty



"A launching State shall be **absolutely liable** to pay compensation for damage caused by its space object on the surface of the earth or to aircraft flight."

"In the event of damage being caused elsewhere than on the surface of the earth to a space object of one launching State or to persons or property on board such a space object by a space object of another launching State, the latter shall be liable only if the damage is due to its fault or the fault of persons for whom it is responsible." Articles II and III of the Liability Convention




