Art. 52 UN-Charter

Nothing in the present Charter precludes the existence of regional arrangements or agencies for dealing with such matters relating to the maintenance of international peace and security as are appropriate for regional action provided that such arrangements or agencies and their activities are consistent with the Purposes and Principles of the United Nations.



A Planetary Defence Organization complies with the "regional" criterion

- Activities of a planetary defence organization are geographically confined to Outer Space.
- A planetary defence organization's field of operation includes the maintenance of peace and security from NEO-threats.



NEO-threats are matters relating to the maintenance of international peace and security

- The Security Council's discretion in making determinations on "threats to the peace" includes natural threats.
- NEO-impacts are natural threats with effect on the global environment.



The "arrangements or agencies" criterion provides for institutional flexibility

- Members can decide upon the degree of institutionalization.
- Due to the structural flexibility, multiple actors may participate.
- An "agency" may also qualify as international organization.



A regional security organization for planetary defence may incur international legal personality

- if created by at least two States or international organizations,
- by any type of instrument governed by international law,
- with its own organs able to express the organization's "own will" and
- aimed at achieving specific tasks.



An international organization for planetary defence may be subject to international space law

 Due to its international legal personality, an IO for planetary defence may declare its acceptance of the UN Space Treaties.

Conclusion



Art. 52 UN-Charter includes a regional organization aimed at deterring NEO-threats as matters relating to the maintenance of international peace and security with international legal personality.

A closer collaboration between the UN-Security Council and a regional security organization for planetary defence may effectively prevent NEO-impacts.
