INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND

- Digital storytelling (DS) has the potential to meaningfully capture peoples' experiences and share them in a highly engaging manner (Rieger et al, 2018).
- DS combines the art of telling stories with digital media, including text, pictures and recorded audio narration. These multimedia elements are blended together to tell a story that revolves around a specific theme (Robin, 2016) to create compelling accounts of experience and used to educate others.
- □ This is particularly useful within health to understand the perspectives of service users (Hardy & Sumner, 2018), in this case those of parents' experiences in neonatal care. Parents articulate powerful emotional accounts during their neonatal care trajectory (Turner et al, 2013) which need to be understood & learnt.

CREATION OF DIGITAL STORIES

- A narrative-based approach was used to interview 23 parents about their experience of having a premature baby. Stories were constructed from their narratives using a process of core-story creation (Petty et al, 2018). Metaphor analysis was undertaken for common themes to inform digital story development.
- Eight common metaphor clusters were identified and used to create digital stories to depict the parent emotional experience and act as a learning tool to enhance empathic understanding.

IMPLICATIONS FOR PRACTICE

- Digital stories constructed from raw narratives in the context of underpinning constructivism can provide a medium or an 'end-product' (Kim, 2015) to use for learning resource development. This can then contribute to the education of students and/or health professionals in relation to learning about, and understanding their patients' experiences through narrative pedagogy (Gazarian, 2010; Price et al, 2015).
- For empathic learning, there is a creative power held by metaphor and digital storytelling to educate others about emotional experiences as demonstrated by user evaluation. Such innovation can be disseminated globally.
