Prof. Kelvin Hong is an Interventional Radiologist and specialist in Liver cancer, sought after for expertise in liver-directed treatments including locoregional therapies for liver cancer and other diseases related to the liver, bile ducts and gallbladder.

Prof. Hong has various leadership roles, including head and division chief of Vascular & Interventional Radiology at the Johns Hopkins Hospital and University, Baltimore MD USA, and the Executive Vice Chair of the Department of Radiology at Johns Hopkins.

Prof. Hong earned his medical degree from South Africa's University of Witwatersrand Medical School and completed Radiology reg time and FCRad (SA) before departing for America for further formal Radiology training, including his Residency and IR fellowship training at the Johns Hopkins Hospital; and has remained on faculty since 2004.

Dr Hong has extensive clinical practice with Interventional Oncology patients, who performs minimally invasive procedures that include thermal ablation (RFA, microwave), chemo-embolisation and Y90 radio-embolisation and other liver-focused procedures including trans hepatic endoscopic diagnosis and treatment.

His research interest is also focused on the outcomes of minimally invasive cancer treatments and new novel techniques, including the impact of local and systemic treatment combinations.
