Malcolm de Roubaix is a retired anaesthesiologist with doctorates in medicine and applied ethics (bioethics). He has published more than thirty peer-reviewed articles in journals of philosophy, applied ethics medical law, and medicine.

He has written three book chapters and two books, including Hoop, Heling en Harmonie: Dink nuut oor siekte en genesing, written in his home language, Afrikaans, which won the 2021 Andrew Murray Book Prize. Cambridge Scholars published his book Responsible Reproductive Choice in the 21st Century in 2023.

Amongst others, he has chaired a research ethics committee of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Stellenbosch, and is currently a Research Fellow of the Centre for Applied Ethics at the university's Department of Philosophy.
