Dr Grainger graduated in medicine from Nottingham University and joined the Northern Radiology training scheme based in Newcastle. Dr Grainger subsequently undertook a musculoskeletal radiology fellowship at UCSF, San Francisco. Dr Grainger currently works as a Musculoskeletal Radiologist at Cambridge University Hospitals having previously worked in Leeds. While undertaking examinations and procedures across the field of MSK radiology,

Dr Grainger has interests in sports and arthritis imaging. These areas form the basis of his research, which has led to over 100 publications. Dr Grainger is an enthusiastic teacher, lecturer and demonstrator having twice won the Leeds training scheme trainer of the year award, voted for by trainee radiologists. Further afield he is in great demand as a lecturer and tutor on national and international platforms.

He has authored 18 book chapters in the field of MSK radiology and co-edited 3 books. He was involved in the development and provision of sports imaging services for the London 2012 Olympics, Manchester Commonwealth Games and World Indoor Athletics (Birmingham). Dr Grainger has served on the executive committee of the International Skeletal Society and European Society of Skeletal Radiology, on program planning committees for the ISS and European Congress of Radiology. He is on the Scientific Program Committee and European Liaison Committees of the RSNA. He co-organises the British Musculoskeletal Ultrasound Course and has had responsibility for delivering other MSK ultrasound courses including the ISS ultrasound course. Dr Grainger is a member of the editorial board for Skeletal Radiology and is currently Vice President of the British Society of Skeletal Radiology.
