Guidelines for Abstract Submissions

Overview information for submission

Please visit <u>www.npapn-aberdeen.co.uk</u> for the Abstracts portal. Authors may submit for the following:

- Oral: A 10-15-minute oral presentation by the author(s) (maximum presentation time is 15 minutes)
- Poster: A visual presentation that will be displayed during poster sessions
- **Symposium:** A 60-minute session with a maximum of three presenters on a common topic relevant to Advanced Practice. A coordinator/moderator may also be included but they will not be counted in the total number of presenters.
- **Clinical workshop:** A 60-minute session focused on a clinical topic delivered in workshop format with the aim of instructing Advanced Practice Nurses.
- 1. The abstract text must be no more than 300 words (not including title and authors' information) and should highlight the main points the presenter/s wish to communicate. If your abstract exceeds this length, it will not be saved.
- 2. Mandatory requirements for abstracts:
 - a. Abstracts MUST be submitted in English. No other language will be accepted and will be deleted immediately after the submission system closes.
 - b. A maximum of 8 co-authors may submit a joint abstract.
 - c. Abstracts must be original and have not been presented elsewhere
 - d. There is a limit of two (2) abstracts per first submitting author, however, you can be a co-author of an unlimited number of abstracts.
- 3. Abstracts are to be submitted via the online portal: www.npapn-aberdeen.co.uk
- 4. The abstract can be submitted in ONLY ONE of the following presentation preference types:
 - Oral presentation: A 10-15 minute presentation (8+2 or 12+3, presentation and Q&A)
 - b. Poster: A presentation of research with an academic or professional focus by an individual or representatives of research teams for physical display.
 - c. The ICN NP/APN Network Scientific Committee reserves the right to reclassify submitted abstracts into the most appropriate presentation type.
- 5. Only fully completed presenter profiles and abstract submissions (marked as final) will be reviewed (please make sure to submit all "Draft" abstracts before the deadline).
- 6. Applicants will be notified in week commencing 26 February 2024 that their abstract has been accepted.
- 7. Those whose abstracts are accepted must register at least one author to present at the Conference by the Early Bird deadline. Accepted abstracts will be eliminated from the programme after this date if registration and fee payment have not been received.
- 8. All decisions on abstract acceptance are final. Once the decision has been rendered on an abstract, no further correspondence will be undertaken on the selection process.
