

Dr Francisco Saúte is the Scientific Director at the Manhiça Health Research Centre in Mozambique. He is member of various Technical Advisory Groups of the WHO/Global Malaria Program. He also plays a leadership role in, regional and sub-regional malaria elimination initiatives, in the SADC region; namely, the Elimination 8 and the MOSASWA (a cross-border malaria collaboration between Mozambique, South Africa and Eswatini). In Mozambique he is member of the Malaria Technical Advisory Committee to the Health Minister.

Dr Saúte has been Resident Advisor for the US President's Malaria Initiative in Angola and Rwanda. He also served as Director of the National Malaria Control Program and Head of Communicable Disease Division at the Ministry of Health in Mozambique.

Dr Saúte earned his PhD in Malaria Epidemiology from the Barcelona University, his Master in Communicable Disease Epidemiology from the University of London and his Medical Degree from the Eduardo Mondlane University, Mozambique.
