Abstract

The European society is aging and the current demographic situation has an inflence on the economic growth and the solidariety between different generations (EU Parliament 2020). In the last 50 years, the technical, economical and social challenges have influenced both urban and rural areas. However, while rural areas in proximity of large urban centres benefitted from a rapid metropolitan development (e.g. job opportunities, infrastructures, presence of essential services), the countryside falls behind. Areas that are far away from cities are suffering from a substantial unemployement rate, the lack of basic services, and the systematic tendency of young people to leave. This special session is devoted to bring together experts to discuss current and future theories and methodological approaches, as well as examples and case studies. The goal is to contextualise the opportunities and potential solutions (both institutional and not) to help and support the young population of rural areas, also to overcome the dramatic impact of the covid-19.
