Key challenges and significant events

- 1. Fires still continue to occur, either by the community or by corporations
- 2. The process of proving in court is sometimes disrupted by the failure of the judge to understand the problem that occurred
- 3. It is necessary to find a way out for the community not to burn but still be able to cultivate their land without burning



Key challenges and significant events

- 4. The government still needs a scientific base in producing its policies
- 5. It is necessary to increase capacity through both national and international cooperation in the process of controlling forest and land fires
- 6. Fire control is no longer just dealing with how to control it, but rather how to reduce the greenhouse gas emissions it produces



Networking activities

- 1. Conducting enlightenment to the public, both nationally and internationally, carried out online, for example through both national and international webinars
- 2. Conduct on-site training whether related to the use of satellites or direct field practice both nationally and internationally



Networking activities

- 3. Giving awards to those who have succeeded in controlling forest and land fires in collaboration with national and international CSOs
- 4. Carry out international cooperation in order to improve understanding skills related to extreme fires
- 5. Participate in international and national level meetings

Progress in Integrated Fire Management

- 1. Draft of Indonesia's climate change law plan being prepared
- 2. Finalize the draft climate change law plan
- 3. Help develop permanent solutions to control forest and land fires
- 4. Peer-reviewed publications on calculating correct greenhouse gas emissions based on field facts specifically for peatlands
 5. Become a bridge of cooperation with the FIRE SIMULATOR provided by France in the Southeast Asian Countries for the first time



Institutional capacity building and policy development

- Increasing international, regional (ASEAN) and national cooperation in managing forest and land fires
- Increasing institutional capacity through training both internationally and regionally and nationally
- Giving awards to firefighters who are considered to have succeeded in controlling fires, both individuals and groups
- Preparation of an application that can be used by the public in order to make them more aware of the threat of smoke and particles in their area when a fire occurs
