

Identify possible future cooperation actions between USAID/USDA Forest Service, Brazilian institutions and key local partners.










Assessment Methodology: a process for better decision making



More than 50 surveys answered by Federal, State and Local institutions, including NGO's and Universities







Main Assessment Findings (2021)



Wildland Fire Training with Indigenous communities in Brazil Foto: USFS, 2010

- Great socio-ecological diversity. Support needed at different levels (both federal, state and local).
- Federal fire management institutions have a really good understanding about integrated fire management.
- Each federal fire management institution have a clear vision about what they need to do to improve.
 But they need more resources and support to do it.
- A bill has already been proposed with a (Federal) Integrated Fire Management Policy.

What can we (USAID/USDA Forest Service) support?

- Governance: i.e. Federal Wildland Fire Coordinating/Working Group.
- Federal Standards (Federal Qualification System i.e.).
- Federal ICS / NIMS.
- Wildfire origin and cause investigation.
- Fire education, prevention and burned areas recovery.
- Interoperability (communication systems, information management, SOP's, i.e.).
- More training for everyone
- Support Indigenous and local communities, NGO's and volunteer organizations.
- Support fire management gender equity and inclusion
