

# Terms & Conditions for sponsorships – EACWE 2025

These Terms and Conditions concern the EACWE 2025 conference held in Trondheim, Norway June 17 to 19, 2025.

## Terms and Conditions for Exhibition/Sponsoring

*Exhibitors and sponsors agree to the following terms and conditions.*

1. This contract concerns all conferences, both physical and digital organised by NTNU Conferences. The organiser retains the right to adjust the number of opening days and times, as well as postponing or cancelling the conferences.
2. The exhibitor will be informed of any changes in due time before the event or as soon as this is possible.
3. The registration is binding. In the event of cancellation, the exhibitor will obtain a refund of the paid amount excluding a cancellation fee of 25% of the value of the sponsorship if the cancellation is made before March 15, 2025. There will be no right to compensation beyond that. Cancellations made after March 15, 2025 will not be refunded. This also applies to any additional equipment/content ordered. The registration is also binding if the organiser changes the dates for the events.
4. All prices are given in NOK and are subject to 25% VAT.
5. The registration is also binding if the number of opening days and times are changed and the organiser moves the event to a different location, but this must be within the same geographical area.
6. If the exhibitor is planning to not make use of their stand, this must be notified beforehand so that the organiser can dispose of the area differently. This is also to avoid empty stands and to be able to give the audience correct information about who is represented at the fair.
7. Unless otherwise agreed, the attendance fee should be paid a minimum of 2 months prior to the conference. If exhibitors fail to meet the specified payment deadline, they can lose the allocated stand/spot.
8. Exhibitors are responsible for preparing their stand with all that is required for both physical and digital stand (if both are applicable).
9. Only exhibitors that have registered and paid the attendance fee will have the right to participate at the conference. Only one exhibitor per stand is allowed unless otherwise agreed with the organiser.

10. The organiser has the right to reject exhibitors both at the time of registering and during the events if the organiser believes that the exhibitor is not suitable for the event, or for any other critical reason. In this case, the exhibitor will obtain a refund of any paid fees but will have no right to compensation beyond that.
11. Banners and posters are allowed only on your own stand (not in the general exhibition area). Stand equipment and/or walls which are higher than 2,5 metres and the covering of stand must be approved by the organiser first. If you have an open end and/or open corner stand, you cannot cover these with your own stand walls. Other solutions must be agreed on with the organiser.
12. All registered exhibitors are committed to the regulations and cannot make any reservations against it.
13. For the sake of other exhibitors, the stand area must be designed in accordance with the current exhibitor map. Equipment associated with the stand must be kept within its own stand area.
14. Safety. Exhibitors are not to use any form of fire lit candles, gas balloons, or other things that could cause a fire or trigger fire detectors.
15. The organiser is not liable for damage to and loss of objects, stand equipment, and stand elements brought in by the exhibitor. This also applies to vehicles parked on the event grounds by exhibitors and their employees or commissioned third parties.
16. The exhibitor must ensure that visitors and third parties do not damage anything or injure persons in their exhibition area. The exhibitor is liable for all personal injury or property damage caused by visitors or third parties due to insufficient supervision by the exhibitor connected with the event. Likewise, the exhibitor is liable for all damage to buildings, halls, and furnishings caused by the exhibitor or the exhibitor's employees, vicarious agents and representatives, or their employees.
17. Within the exhibition rooms, filming, photography, and the making of drawings and video recordings are only permitted to persons who have been approved for this purpose by the organiser.
18. Photographs, drawings, film, and video recordings of the event/exhibition, the stands, and the exhibits may be made by the organiser or by a third party commissioned by the organiser. The organiser is entitled to use these for advertising purposes or general press publications within the company group.
19. The implementation of further advertising measures outside the stand on the event area is prohibited.

20. The exhibitor is responsible for keeping his stand clean and tidy. After the event, the exhibitor must leave the exhibition areas in a clean and tidy condition. Garbage or other objects left behind by the exhibitor after clearing the stand area will be removed and destroyed by the organiser at the exhibitor's expense.
21. The exhibitor is responsible for ensuring that any give-aways comply with the Norwegian Food Authority's current rules and regulations. Alcohol is not permitted.

## **Terms and Conditions exhibitor representatives**

*Exhibitor representatives agree to the following terms and conditions.*

A change of keynotes, presenters or venue does not entitle the contracting party to withdraw from the contract or to terminate the contract.

### **Cancellation/change of registration**

For the repayment, we will use the same payment method that you used for the original transaction unless something else has been expressly agreed upon; in no case will you be charged for this repayment.

The organiser is not liable for the loss or theft of the representative's belongings (wardrobe, training material, valuables, technology, etc.) and vehicles, nor for damage to the same or accidents. The respective house rules are to be observed.

The content you submit must not contain any intellectual property of third parties (for example, material protected by copyright), unless you have obtained permission from the copyright holder or are otherwise authorized by law. You are legally liable and responsible for the content you submit and make available through the service.

### **Force Majeure**

If an event is prevented from taking place due to a disruption at the event location or in the event of "force majeure" (including cases such as war, revolutions, strikes, natural disasters or pandemics that are beyond our sphere of influence), we may postpone the event once to a reasonable new date or hold the event as an online event. If the event is held purely online, the participation fee for the on-site tickets will automatically be adjusted to the participation fee for online participation. An alternative date within the next 12 weeks for non-seasonal events is considered reasonable. If an event cannot be held within a reasonable period of time or if the "force majeure" lasts longer than three months, we will cancel the event and you will receive a refund of the event fee, if paid. Refund claims by a participant due to merely temporary disruptions of an event (especially in the case of digital events) are excluded.
