
Interviews with 10 experts from research translation, technology assessment, responsible research and innovation, research ethics, philosophy of science, and history of science and technology.











#### **BALANCE**






- a. Incentive structure, without compromising basic/blue sky research or academic independence in research agenda setting
- **b.** Coherency in quality systems, while acknowledging that basic research is different from translation
- c. Communication between RPOs and industry, very upstream on the translation pathways, without compromising academic in research agenda setting

- **d.** The target audience by involving policy advisors, lobbyists, think-tanks, and journalists, since they have a significant influence on the decisions of policymakers
- e. The focus of RI to activities across supply chains, e.g.
  working conditions where raw materials are extracted for
  translation to come into being










Do you think that the consultation document we have sent you:


A list of more than 160 comments (and still receiving), from 60 registered participants were compiled into three categories:


To provide space for additional input using a World Café setting (~40 participants)




#### Focus Track – Part 2




To "provoke" participants with a number of small statements ~50 participants

- 5. Can academia be aided by industry on RI practices?








# A preliminary list of the most prominent comments

- 8. Is there a need for education and training on research translation and end-user engagement?


