Brighton has more restaurants than there are days in the year – and new ones spring up all the time. With a creatively diverse foodie scene within a stone's throw of the beach, you will be amazed at the array of affordable eateries in the city.

It is almost impossible to create a Top 15 of recommendations but after much discussion, the VisitBrighton team have managed to do that. The eateries below are in no particular order but all are within walking distance of your conference venue.

All the restaurants listed can accommodate bookings – big or small.

Vegetarian: Terre a Terre
