



Abstract Submission Terms and Conditions

By submitting an abstract you have agreed to the terms and conditions as set out below.

1. By submitting an abstract you agree to give us permission on behalf of all presenters if it is accepted for presentation, to publish, reproduce, distribute, display and store the abstract (submitted text only), together with author names, and biographies where supplied in different formats including print, electronic and digital forms.
2. The author is responsible for the accuracy of the abstract, including typing, spelling or language errors and should ensure that they have written entirely original work which does not infringe any copyright.
3. The corresponding author should ensure that all appropriate co-authors are included on the abstract and that the submission has been approved by all authors.
4. At least one author must be available to present the abstract if selected for the programme for either an oral or poster presentation.
5. All authors presenting at the conference must register and pay the relevant registration fee to attend the conference. If the presenting author is not registered, the abstract will be withdrawn. The authors should immediately notify the organizing committee if they are unable to present an abstract or if the presenting author is changed.
6. Any conflict of interest must be declared and displayed on the title slide (for oral presentations) or at the bottom of the poster. All presentations should include funding and other acknowledgements where applicable.
7. You give us permission to photograph your oral presentation at the conference, which may be used on the UKAEA SOFE website.
8. Abstracts will be reviewed by a panel with the final decision being made by the Technical Programme Committee. Evaluation of the abstract is done on the standard of the content presented.
9. The Technical Programme Committee may decide to allocate the submitted abstract to a different topic than the topic for which it was submitted.
10. Acceptance of an abstract does not imply provision of travel, accommodation or registration for the conference, nor any other cost associated with preparation or presentation of the abstract, or any cost associated with attendance at the conference.

11. The author's abstract will be printed in the conference journal. The journal acts as a collection of abstracts accepted to conference or meetings organised by UKAEA.

12. If the abstract presenter wishes to withdraw their abstract, they must notify the conference organisers as soon as possible.

13. All communications regarding the abstract will be directed to the abstract submitter. It is the responsibility of the abstract submitter to inform the co-authors of the abstract acceptance status.
