Ethics of Environmental Nudging : A Systematic Literature Review using PRISMA-Ethics

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Research Question: What are prominent ethical themes occuring in discussions specific to ethics of environmental/green/energy/climate nudges?

Environmental Nudges

Nudges are intentional modifications in the decision-making environment that influence choices of people without significantly altering their monetary incentives or coercing them.

A nudges B when A makes it more likely that B will engage in an environmentally sustainable action w. A nudges B by triggering B's shallow cognitive processes. In doing so, A's influence preserves B's choice-set and is substantially non-controlling and easily resistible by B.

Methodology

For systematic reviews in ethics, a method known as PRISMA-Ethics (PRISMA is an acronym for Preferred Reporting Items for Systematic Reviews and Meta-Analyses) has been proposed to make the literature searches comprehensive and transparent.

We adopted PRISMA-Ethics guidelines to search and synthesise literature on ethics of green nudges. This literature review is based on a search conducted across five databases: Web of Science, Scopus, Philpapers, JSTOR, and ScienceDirect.

Using Environmental Nudges to minimise carbon footprint

Nudges can be used for: Minimising energy consumption, incentivising correct waste sorting in households, promoting vegetarian and/or vegan food choices over meat-based ones, promoting use of public transport, and using recyclable coffee mugs (Goldstein, Gounaridis, Newell , 2020; Little Book on Green Nudges 2020).

Search Query Construction

Queries were constructed using three strings with terms combined using OR operator. String A: "nudge", nudges", and "nudging" String B: "ethic*", "moral*", "norm*", "libert*" String C: "climat*", "anthropocen*", "green", "environment*"

A,B, and C were combined using the AND operator.
